WHAT IS GORMAN HERITAGE FARM?

Gorman Heritage Farm is a non-profit organization that educates about agriculture, nutrition, sustainability, and the environment. The farm is reliant on volunteer support in order to maintain the farming on their 122 acres, especially with the type of farming that they do – focusing on healthy soil with regenerative agriculture practices. They serve about 5000 students each year, and it is important to them that our community knows the environmental benefits of regenerative, sustainable agriculture and that we have the ability to learn those practices through hands-on work here at the farm.
