Agenda

1. the one Big Question:

Whether and how to include Open Educational Resources in the registry

2. the second semi big question:

we need clear guidelines /policy on disseminating open educational materials via DHCR, DARIAH Campus, SSH Marketplace

On the one hand there is **training materials accompanying the courses**, which ideally should be linked to, on the other hand there are “**online courses**” which **could be classified both as a resource and as a course**.

As a resource they would belong to DARIAH Campus, as a course to the ***course*** registry. But we want to **avoid duplication** at least within the registries we have control over.

So we would like to agree on some clear guidance/policy how to deal with these situations.

3. Problem: Flexibility of Metadata (in the DHCR)

- online course – which country to assign? → create new field: ‘worldwide’
→ applies to all countries?
Alternatively: Create city and country "Remote" for all OER courses (see [git issue](#))
e.g.: UPSKILLS moodle courses ([overview](#)) - OER; no specific country assigned; course for independent studies;
 - entry in DHCR: <https://dhcr.clarin-dariah.eu/#770> -> **keep or delete?**
 - entry in the SSH Open Marketplace:
<https://marketplace.sshopencloud.eu/training-material/yweKFs>
 - another example of a DH course + training materials:
<https://www.clarin.eu/content/introduction-digital-humanities>
 - possible to add them to the campus and preserve their own identity; qualifies as an external resource; cannot be dumped - translate the moodle course into the formats supported on campus;
 - add them as an external resource to the campus - make them more findable than the registry;
 - remove from the registry and add it to the campus; use it as a pilot and enlist it; use it as a basis for other courses;
 - once a course is added to the campus will be automatically added to the marketplace and later to the EOSC catalogue

- Problem: recurring - what if a course/workshop only happens a couple of times a year on an irregular basis?? How to include in the registry data-format wise? Create a new entry each time? Amend existing entry?

- Problem: International MA Programmes (e.g. [European Masters in Technology for Translation and Interpreting](#)), taking place in different countries – how to implement??

- etymology

Toma

- pointers to course materials to courses already in registry are fine
- something that has a starting and ending date fits into registry (event)
- MOOCs in stricter sense as event
- DHCR “for everything that needs enrollment” - **synchronous**
→ possibility: point to material on DC;
- DC - material without enrollment - self study; **asynchronous**
(Vicky: also to host Material, DC)
Hub for ALL training materials in DARIAH
- DHCR embedded on DC: to see ‘the news’ in the DH landscape on one glimpse
→ USP: DHCR is both CLARIN & DARIAH Resource -> include the logos on the main page

Vicky

- subscribe to Toma’s distinction
- circularity DARIAH-Campus => DHCR

Iulianna

- training material from a project ([upskills](#))
- CLARIN does not have a platform for training
- currently hosted for one year at Uni Belgrad
- archived as zip in a slovenian CLARIN repository
- for discovery used: DHCR and marketplace
- describe how users can log in
- develop a training strategy, include the Parthenos (next year will stop being maintained)

Toma:

- non-DARIAH training material in DARIAH Campus is fine
- hosted somewhere externally = external resource
- DARIAH-Campus not suitable for dumping moodle content
- converting from moodle to D-C (git-based) involves manual work/conversion
- What about moodle-hosting expiring?
- separate channels for individual sources possible

Vicky:

- moodle / learning materials on DHCR - confusing

Iulianna

- online course

Matej

- distinction between moodle LMS and +/- static git-based approach
- do the courses really need moodle?
lot of interactive content, or rather static material
- options for CLARIN:
 - run own "CLARIN" moodle instance
 - adopt DARIAH-Campus for CLARIN training materials?

Toma

- use upskills-project as pilot for adopting D-C for CLARIN
- Suggestion: Iulianna can take upskills as a pilot and draft something, 'a translation' from moodle to be included into DC; pay attention: Moodle courses: video + text vs. interactive content?
- if on D-C => will be propagated to SSH Open Marketplace (and EOSC Catalogue)

Moodle solution for the future is **not** recommended

→ CLARIN needs to come up with a policy; then we can take things further

possible way of 'dividing' catalogs/resources below: synchronous vs. asynchronous

- **DARIAH-Teach** -> Open Educational Resources (OER) for Arts and Humanities, hosted on Moodle ~~and produced in DARIAH Projects~~ (DARIAH Central has no influence on what happens in DARIAH teach; Susan Schreibman is the master of DT)
- EOSC Catalogue - <https://marketplace.eosc-portal.eu/> (EOSC is a moving target, it will take a while to work seamlessly)
