Publications that are more regionally focused or that address the history of Spokane in a minor way have been excluded, for the most part, from this work. For the aid of the user, five chronological categories have been created, as well as a sixth category, general histories, for publications that span three or more of the chronological categories. These categories are not perfect but allow the user to quickly find resources without having to search through an exhaustive list of categories and sub-categories.
