3. Get a head start on applying to jobs. By the end of React Week 5 you should have at least 9 applications.
4. Practice Technical Interview Questions with a pair following the Thursday lessons for the week in LearnHowToProgram.
5. Have you been on [meetup.com](#) yet to find groups you're interested in? For the Portland area, check out [calagator](#) as well.
6. Revisit your LinkedIn profile. Is everything updated since you've progressed at Epicodus? Does it convey the narrative you want to tell about yourself?
 - a. **Exercise:** Pair up with someone and exchange LinkedIn profiles. Take about 2 minutes to read each other's profiles. Have your pair introduce themselves as you using the only the information written in your LinkedIn. Does your pair convey an accurate and positive narrative about you?
