I write to you today regarding Anugwom Izuchukwu Goodluck, a frontline care worker facing a deportation order from the UK Home Office. Anugwom's mother and brother are UK citizens, he does not have close family back in Nigeria, and he wishes to stay here in the UK.

I am deeply troubled and upset at the unfair treatment and unjust deportation order issued against him. I stand in solidarity with Anugwom and ask the Home Office to reconsider this unconscionable decision. Anugwom is a shining example of the type of individual who we should honour in the country, having put his own life at risk while working as a frontline careworker throughout the pandemic. I demand that this government treat carers with the respect and dignity they deserve, putting into practice the principles they preach - the applause and verbal praise the government is happy to publicly display is meaningless if this is how they choose to reward their key workers.

I applaud Anugwom's selflessness during this pandemic, and I implore you and the Home Office to guarantee his right to remain in this country and to resolve this gross injustice, commending his efforts and resolve. I request that you use your elected platform to represent the views of your constituents, to urge the authorities to act with compassion and with respect.

## I urge you to:

- Write to the Home Secretary, Priti Patel, and demand that she reconsider and revoke this unjust deportation.

I am hopeful that with your support this matter can be resolved swiftly, and Anugwom will be treated in a manner deserving of his selfless work, as evidence that our frontline workers are not dispensable.
