Principal's Report:

1. Outdoor School Improvements: Paving and seeding of Kinder area and by playground; basketball nets, painting of outer doors, line painting on tarmac (Next steps: purchasing of equipment and kinder line painting with COBs funds).

- Lowered basketball nets by primary doors.
- Junior and Intermediate courts have been done.
- Hopscotch is being used frequently.
- We wanted to use COBs money to create paint lines and activities on the tarmac. The kinder kids have a nice tarmac, but not many games.
- Renita asked if we could have PickleBall nets? Parents agreed the students would like it. Ms. Roger said they are using the basketball courts. Mrs. Libera said we were hoping to get the court in there and we can look into it.
- We are hoping to use the money from the COBs bread fundraising for more outdoor games now that the work has been done.

2. Reorganization of Intermediate Division (from 4 classes to 3: Grade 7 Fraser; Grade 7/8 Wall; Grade 7/8 Roger).

- We don't ever want to do it but we had less enrollment than we were expecting and numbers determined that.

3. Extracurriculars: Cross Country, Junior Intermediate Soccer, Intermediate Volleyball.

- Cross Country was a great day. There were 120 kids participating. More kids and bigger races. There were more schools participating, but still the first 10 qualified.
- Junior soccer happened last week, they made it to the playoff and had a great day. Intermediate soccer was Thursday with Mr. Whitehead.
- Ms. Roger is coaching Intermediate Volleyball. It is a long season so we are still looking at determining the team. The game schedule will be posted on the website.

New Business:

Open House (Wed. Oct 2, 2024, 4-5:30pm): Book Fair; Pumpkin and Mum sales; Pizza and water for all; meet the teacher; backpacks and socks.

- All families are welcome to attend Open House. We expect people to be hanging around until 6pm. Some events will be Scholastic Book Fair (Ms. Wink) and other teachers that don't have homerooms.
- Pumpkin sale. Heather looked into getting mums from Niagara College to sell, she will be delivering the same day as pumpkins (next Wed).
- We thought the money could go towards replenishing the Council account (teacher funds etc).
- Mrs. Libera will put out a reminder email about the pumpkins and mum sale, this will go out in the Friday Memo.
- Pizza and water will be available for all families. A reminder will be put out for families to bring water bottles. Plastic water bottles will also be available.

- Classroom will be open so families can meet the teacher.
- There will be backpacks, shirts and socks available if needed.

- Translated version of the census is available. Multi language teachers will be there to support students. LRT and other staff will help students with any questions that come up.
- The board is hoping for an 80% participation rate. The data is used to inform and improve our practices. The information will be released to the public in Feb 2025.

Intermediate Yearbook (provided to all graduates)

- The Intermediate Yearbook is just for grades 7 and 8's for now and the content is about them.
- It would go in the grad box for graduation.
- We are getting some things in motion: a yearbook club, a cover we will get pricing to see what that will cost and trying to figure out what we want it to look like.
- We will get the board to make it through the DSBN print shop (soft cover, staple bound).
- We are looking to start a subcommittee.
- Talking to intermediate teachers to see about getting students to be editors.
