BMS Cello Curriculum

To pass any level for the Young Artists' Certificate, a student must receive an average score of "pass" (from a scale of needs improvement / pass / pass with honors) from a panel of at least three faculty judges.

Repertoire, Methods, Collections, etc. are samples and establish technical and artistic benchmarks. Faculty may use any resources that achieve these benchmarks.

Repertoire alternatives for the evaluation must be approved by the department chair by the start of second semester.

LEVEL ONE:

Essential skills/goals to be attained by completion of level and demonstrated in level evaluation:

- Comfortable body position and proper instrument placement
- Ability to play in tune in one position, recognizing basic finger patterns
- Developing basic bow grip, straight bow, and variety of bow strokes
- Playing pieces of different character and tempo
- Demonstrates ability to play in extended position in addition to regular (closed) position

Level One Evaluation Requirements:

- Four one-octave scales with arpeggios
- One etude
- One piece

LEVEL TWO:

Essential Skills/Goals to be attained by completion of level and demonstrated in level evaluation:

- Secure and flexible body position
- Mastering positions 1 through 3 and proper shifting
- Vibrato on long notes, simple double stops and chords
- Consistent bow grip, comfortable string crossing and bow distribution
- Variety of phrasing and dynamics

Level Two Evaluation Requirements:

- Four two-octave scales and arpeggios
- One etude
- Two contrasting pieces, at least one from memory

LEVEL THREE:

Essential Skills/Goals to be attained by completion of level and demonstrated in level evaluation:

- Balance body position, ability to recognize and avoid tension
- Ability to shift to higher positions
- Consistent vibrato, comfortable double stops and chords
- Variety of bowings, including off the string
- Playing with more expression and making more stylistic choices

Level Three Evaluation Requirements:

- Six three-octave scales and arpeggios
- One etude
- Two contrasting pieces, one of which should be memorized
