Activity/Project

- 1. Now that we have gone through some of the fundamentals with Soundtrap, start a new project and begin to explore these functions on your own.
- 2. This project will be self-assessed, which means that you will grade yourself based on personal reflections about the project. The project is out of 10 marks.
- 3. Your project must at least be one minute in length. Be certain to think about your listening audience and use musical concepts such as 'layering' for interest.
- 4. Be certain that your teacher and at least one student are project collaborators.
- 5. When sharing your project, other students can suggest ideas or adjust tracks to enhance your project, but in the end, you are the producer. You must only allow and make the decisions that you feel are best.
- 6. When completed, we will have a Project Class Listening Party, where each student will provide a brief introduction about their project and play it for the class.
- 7. There is a checklist provided to help make your self-assessing easier.
- 8. Your goal is to attempt to respond with a 'YES' answer for ALL the Required Checklist Points and a 'YES' answer for FIVE (explaining one in more detail) of the Choice Checklist Points.
