

Folding ¼ yd Quilting Fabric - Instructions

¼ yard only

The purpose of these instructions is to have consistency in how we fold the fabric so it fits in the boxes easily and looks neat. We fold these pieces of fabric into 9-inch wide rectangles so they fit properly. It is important to not make them smaller (they become thicker and take up more space) or larger (they will not fit in the box).

Supplies

- Sample product
- (about 8 strips of the pre-cut tags per bin—please do not take all the available price tags)
- Measuring tape

Instructions

1. Fold your fabric selvage to selvage.
2. Lay the strip of fabric flat so the selvage edge is at the bottom and the folded edge is at the top.
3. If the strip is wider than ¼ yd, fold one cut edge in so that the strip is no wider than 9".
4. Fold the strip in half, bringing the folded edge down to meet the selvage edge.
5. Fold the strip in half again, bringing the top folded edge down. You should have a roughly 9" x 5" rectangle (see pic below).
6. Neatly stack all the folded pieces together with all the folded edges facing the same direction.
7. Neatly place all the stacks in the bin and return to processing.
