I am writing to express my concern about a recent BBC documentary titled "India: The Modi Question". I feel that this program was deeply biased and misleading, and I believe it falls short of the standards that the BBC should be held to as a publicly funded broadcaster.

In particular, I was disturbed by the way that the program portrayed the current Prime Minister of India, Narendra Modi. The program was one-sided, presenting a skewed view of Modi's policies and actions, and failing to give him a fair hearing.

Furthermore, I believe that the program was also lacking in impartiality and accuracy. The program relied heavily on testimonies from proven liars and made sweeping claims about the situation in India without providing any substantive evidence to support those claims. This is unacceptable for a broadcaster that is supposed to be committed to impartiality and accuracy.

I urge Ofcom to investigate this matter further and to take appropriate action to ensure that the BBC is held accountable for its reporting on India and other important issues. The public deserves to have access to accurate and impartial information, and the BBC has a responsibility to provide it.

Reason for dissatisfaction with the outcome of the BBC's final response

The BBC avoided my actual complaint and as a tax-paying and TV licence fee-paying British Hindu, it is unacceptable for my community to be demonised by the BBC. Hindus have a right to balanced, well-researched programmes that give us a voice.
