This specialization allows students to explore how faith-centered approaches can be applied in healthcare, supporting holistic care that addresses the physical, emotional, and spiritual well-being of patients. Students will learn how to lead healthcare initiatives that incorporate spiritual care, providing compassionate support for patients and families. This minor is ideal for students who wish to integrate their faith with leadership roles in healthcare, ensuring that patient care is rooted in both professional standards and spiritual principles.
