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## Travel & visitor tips

Do you have any insider tips for Toronto? Public transportation, tipping culture, safety tips, things to avoid, etc?

Toronto is a relatively safe city, just be sure to have your wits about you like any major city.

**Public transport** is quite limited compared to other cities of Toronto's size. You can tap your credit card for transit, so you don't need to buy any passes. Apple/Google pay works on all TTC, GO transit. Don't fuss with passes, just set up your credit card as an express transit pass and tap your credit card for transit instead.

**Tipping culture** is out of control here. Some machines start at 18% and go up to 25% (!!!). Do not feel pressured to tip more than you can afford or want to. Feel free to select OTHER and enter your tip percentage or amount. You do not have to tip for takeout, even though the machines will prompt you to tip.

Use Green P lots and app for garage and street parking.

**Riverdale** - a small farm (Riverdale West) and a big park with the Toronto city skyline view (Riverdale East).

Leslieville - good access to cool shops and food while being near Woodbine Beach

Roncesvalles - to be near High Park and various shops and restaurants
