






Congratulations to our BEST BUDDIES club for a great kick off event! Lots of smiles, fun, and teamwork all around!

#### New features in this year's contest are:

- 1) Four separate divisions for 5th, 6th, 7th & 8th grade students.
- 2) Awards for Each Grade Level  $-\sqrt{$1,000}$  for 1st;  $\sqrt{$500}$  for 2nd;  $\sqrt{$250}$  for 3rd.

I am pleased to announce that the Grand Lodge Fraternal Committee has selected the theme, "What is your American Dream?" for the 2022-2023 Grand Lodge Americanism Essay Contest. The contest starts with the Local Lodges, progresses through District and State levels, and ends with the naming of our National Winners at the Grand Lodge Session in Minneapolis, MN in July 2023. This contest gives students in four separate grade levels, grades 5-8, the opportunity to thoughtfully, evaluate and express their views on the selected annual theme.

Nationally, first-place, second-place and third-place authors in each division will receive monetary awards of \$1,000, \$500, and \$250 respectfully. Many Lodges, Districts and State Associations also provide various forms of recognition to their respective winners, and the Fraternal Committee appreciates and encourages their extraordinary efforts in support of the contest.

Contest materials including the "annual contest theme" are published on-line on May 1. Lodges are encouraged to communicate with school officials in a timely fashion to facilitate annual curriculum planning.
