Some of the world's oldest cities were built in Palestine, and they were constructed with excellent stone. This building stone and also marble were cut by our ancestors from the Holy Land itself. Today, the stone industry remains very important: with its beautiful colours and excellent quality, Palestinian stone is often preferred by architects round the world.

Stone was not always produced as efficiently as it is now. In ancient times, it was very difficult to cut stone. Everything was done by hand, and it was slow, hard work. Now, however, technology has come to the rescue, and *finished stone* is produced very efficiently.

Over sixty per cent of the 262 quarries are near Hebron and Bethlehem. The stone is then cut and finished by 15000 workers in 618 factories, and many of these are also **in the same area**.

However, quarries are found in other places, too, and there are factories everywhere. Together, **they** produce four point five per cent of the world's building stone. They also make 450 million dollars a year for Palestine, and they provide over 22,000 jobs.

The world stone industry is growing at nine per cent a year. And with our natural advantages, we can raise Palestinian production even faster. But to do this, we need to learn more about different needs round the world. The industry is therefore studying <u>world markets</u> carefully. If it can continue to grow, it will bring Palestine a lot more jobs and money.
