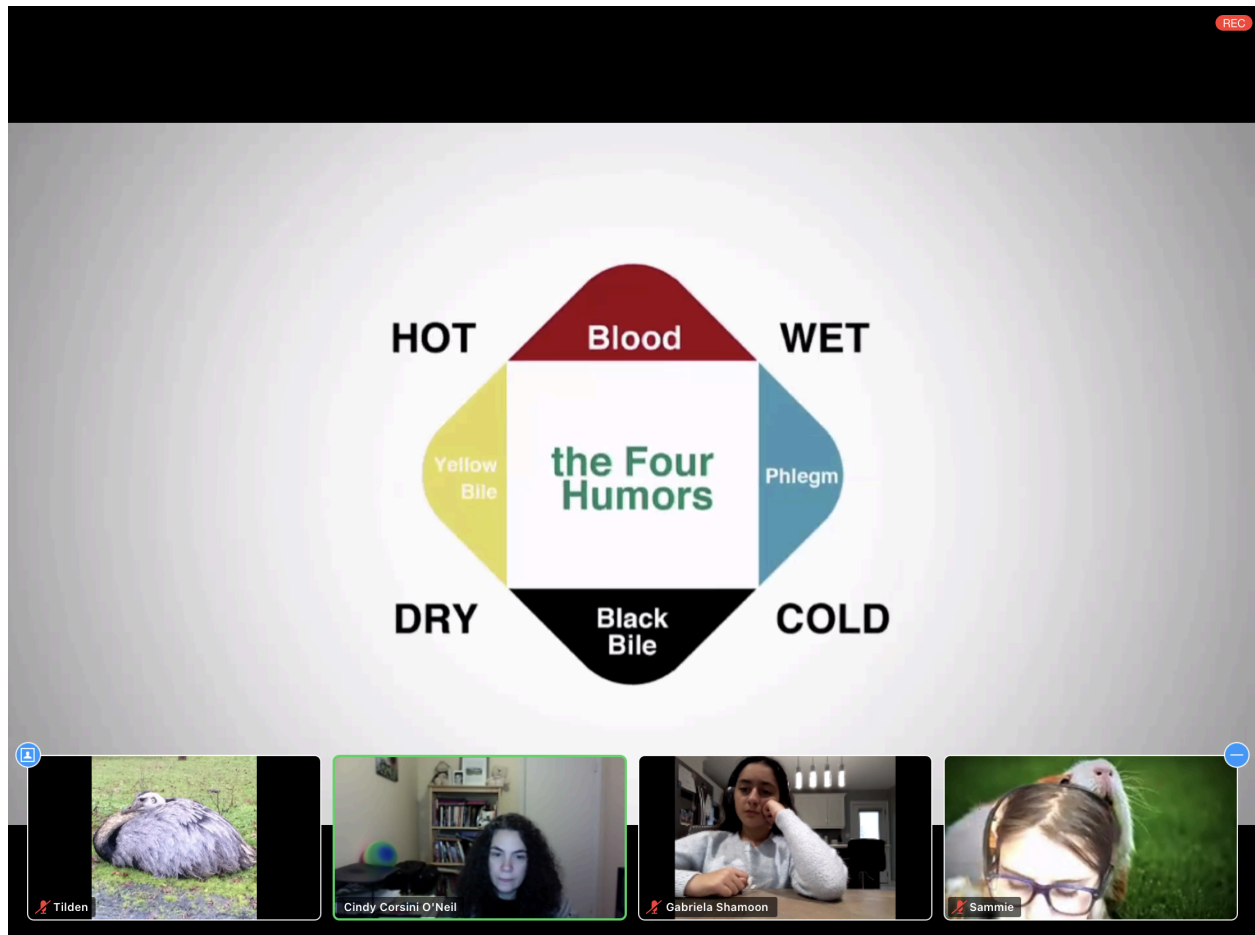


This essay is for what I learned in human anatomy and what I will be telling you, and what my experience was and if I like it or not.

Disease means not (dis) at ease.

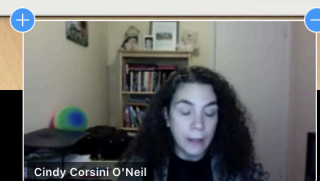
Anything that upsets the normal structure or functioning could be called a disease

Pathology studies the characteristics, causes and effects of disease.

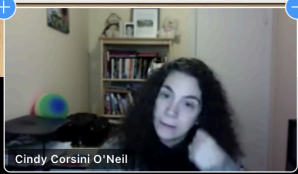
In order to treat a disease the cause (etiology) or illness needs to be found.
