... admitted to conspiring to import live white-tailed deer from February of 2010 through November of 2012 ... the deer came from a facility in Pennsylvania that tested positive for chronic wasting disease...

... White-tailed deer smuggled from Pennsylvania to a Forrest County ranch came from a herd that tested positive for chronic wasting disease, according to the U.S. Attorney's Office in Hattiesburg... a federal charge of violating the Lacey Act ...
