Athletics

Physicals / Athletic Clearance All athletes are required to have a current physical on file with the school in order to participate in sports. Go to the missionprep.org website athletics tab -> drop down to athletic clearance for specific information about uploading your physical and to sign waiver forms. Detailed instructions and video are on this page. Both the physical must be completed/ uploaded and the athlete's athleticclearance.com account must be up to date for athletics participation.

A student must have a complete athletic clearance account for the 2025-2026 school year and a completed physical form uploaded to their account (no paper copies will be accepted) before participating in summer practices or weightlifting.

MCP's annual Athletics Physicals Night will be on Thursday, May 22nd at 6 PM in the MCP gym. More information will be shared on the MCP website, app and calendar.

MCP Gear / Spirit Packs Many of our teams utilize Spirit Packs. These Spirit Packs may include practice shorts, shirts, team sweatshirts, specialized shoes, etc. These items create a positive team spirit, camaraderie and the athletes are able to keep these items from their experience on the team. Rather than having parents buy each individual item, teams will be provided fliers that will include information on how to purchase from our distributors. The Spirit Packs typically range from \$25 - \$200.

Summer Athletic Offerings School wide we will offer group athletic training/lifting Monday – Thursday from 9:00-10:00 AM for our male athletes and from 10:00-11:00 AM for our female athletes. This is an expectation of athletes who desire to play a sport at MCP. We are very excited to offer this for the entire athletic department. Supplies & Service

SUPPLIES

Textbooks: The textbook list and directions for 2025-2026 will be posted on the MCP website by the end of June. The list can be found under the Shop tab > MCP Bookstore. Textbooks (new or used) can be purchased from any source (bookfinder.com, eBay, Amazon...), but the ISBN and Edition must match the booklist. Books will cost approximately \$375 - \$450 for the first year.

Supplemental novels will need to be purchased for English courses and may be bought online at Amazon or a bookseller, or at a local bookstore.

Locks for hall lockers are distributed to the students during orientation on their first day of school free of charge.*

School supplies vary by class. At the start of school, each teacher will provide their students with a course syllabus which will list supplies required for the class, such as notebooks, highlighters, etc.

Graphing calculators are optional for Algebra I and Geometry and mandatory for Algebra II. If you plan to purchase a calculator, the recommended graphing calculator is the TI-83 Plus, TI-84 and TI-84 Plus graphing calculators.

SCHOOL & COMMUNITY SERVICE

As members of the Mission College Prep community, we are called to live according to a pattern of love and service modeled by Jesus Christ. As followers of Christ, we believe that we are all brothers and sisters and that much of the injustice in the world would be extinguished if more people acted on this principle. We try to model this calling in two different types of service.

First, students are required to serve the Mission College Prep community. We find students have a better sense of ownership and belonging when they take an active role in helping care for Mission College Prep and its activities. When students start seeing their classmates and teachers as brothers and sisters through service to the school, it becomes much easier to make the philosophical jump to wanting to serve the larger community.

Second, students are required to reach out past the borders of our school to our city, our state, our country, and our world to apply the idea that everyone is our sister and brother. Over the course of four years, all students will be called to service with younger children, with the elderly and developmentally challenged and with agencies that make a preferential option for the socio-economically disadvantaged.

Freshmen can start their Community Service during this summer. At the start of the school year each student will be given access to a service account where they will log hours. If a student completes service over the summer, we ask them to keep a record of dates, times, and an email address of someone you can verify their service, until their accounts are activated. In addition, MCP has a longstanding relationship as a volunteer partner with People's Kitchen of San Luis Obispo to reliably provide a delicious hot lunch once a month at the Prado Day Center. Every month a class will be assigned to provide all the hot and cold items needed to provide a nutritious meal; each class will be responsible for two (2) People's Kitchen lunches throughout the school year (this is in addition to the service hours required). Student coordinators, working with Stephanie Buresh in the Campus Ministry office, create the food list that identifies the food item each student is responsible to provide on their assigned weekend and will be sent out a few weeks before the assigned dates.

Technology

All students are expected to have access to a keyboard-based computer, both at home and at school. That said, each student should bring their own fully charged laptop on a daily basis. Cell phone and tablets are not acceptable substitutes for bringing a keyboard device to school. A keyboard-based device is the appropriate tool to produce the quality and quantity of academic work that is expected of our students.

While attending MCP there are many online or "in the cloud" systems for student's use. These systems are platform-independent -- they will work with any reasonably modern computer: Windows, Mac, or Chrome. Because our systems are online, Internet access is essential. MCP provides all students, teachers, and guests a fast and secure wireless network while on campus. Similarly, families should have Internet access so that the student may work efficiently from home.

MCP is aware that providing a laptop and/or arranging home Internet access may represent a significant expense for some families. Additional support will be offered to those families facing hardship and who are on Tuition Assistance. Interested families should contact the MCP Business Office. The MCP technology department will help students connect their device(s) to the campus WiFi and will ensure they have access to the online systems. However, MCP cannot provide general computer repair for personal laptops and other devices.

During the school day students may not use their cell phone. This policy is in place from the time of warning bell in the morning until students are dismissed by the bell at the end of the school day. Cell phones, while excellent tools for communication, are exceptionally distracting in the school setting. MCP's investment in our digital campus means laptops and tablets are highly effective for all school assignments and tasks. But the cell phone is undeniably unique from these other devices because of the phone's ability to be used in isolation and in relative anonymity.

We understand that there are rare occasions that may require the use of a student cell phone communication. If the need ever arises during the school day a student may always use their cell phone, with permission from the Director of Student Life or the Attendance Clerk. A student in this situation should first present themselves to office, seeking privacy. When they do, they will also be given permission to take out their phone and make their necessary call. Any emergency communication to the student is best done via the Attendance Desk; and of course, student email, accessed via laptop or tablet, remains an excellent means of communication.

Failure to comply with this regulation may result in the confiscation of the device. The school will not be responsible for the loss, damage, or theft of any cell phone or electronic devices brought to school.

PHILOSOPHY OF ATTENDANCE POLICY

Student's daily presence and engagement in all MCP programming is essential to our ability to fulfill our mission as a school and maximize student formation. Proactive communication in partnership with families is necessary to a student's deeper participation in the community and overall well-being.

In order to maintain this partnership on behalf of the formation of the student, any prolonged absence, such as for serious illness, necessitates school communication not only through the Attendance Office, but also with the student's counselor so that coordination can be made.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

Typically, MCP will communicate after 5 missed periods of any class by means of a letter informing the parents/guardians of the student's attendance status. A parent/guardian phone conference will be requested at 6 missed periods of any class. At 8 or more absences within a single class reflects a significant amount of concern and necessitates a meeting in partnership with families to address the overall reasons behind absences.

There are five very important items to remember with regard to attendance at MCP:

- Call the office anytime your student is absent or arriving later than first period.
- Attendance office email: attendance@missionprep.org
- Send a note if your student is late, needs to leave during the school day for an appointment, or was absent.
- In order for a student to leave during the day for doctor appointments, family commitments, etc., either the parent must send a note in the morning or must sign the student out in the office.
- No students are allowed off campus for lunch unless accompanied by a parent.
- Student presence in class is an essential part of fulfilling requirements for course credit.

PLANNED ABSENCES

For planned absences longer than two days, a student must be given permission by all of his or her teachers as well as the administration in order to be allowed to make up work upon return from absence. The student must make a plan with his or her teachers in order to make up missing work. A planned absences packet must be completed and signed by all parties in order for the late absent and not late work policy to remain in place.

Dress Code

MCP prides itself on creating a culture of accountability for our students. In the implementation of our culture, MCP requires students to come to school well-groomed and appropriately dressed for participation in the educational process. MCP believes there is a direct correlation between student appearance and overall behavior. To be considerate of the whole school environment, we would like to limit the inter that occur during the educational process while students are on campus and in class. We created the MCP dress code philosophy as a culture of positive relationship that we build with students rather than a restrictive disciplinary environment. Therefore this is an opportunity to set the MCP community up for more success and build positive relationships with our MCP families, students, and staff.

Daily Dress Code Philosophy: Comfortable, Modest, and Spirited ONLY the following comfortable, modest, and spirited attire is acceptable for every day school wear for the 2025-2026 school year. Spirited attire is available from MCP's online partner stores (the Shop tab on missionprep.org).

For the full Dress Code description, please refer to the MCP Handbook which can be found on the MCP website.

Here is an abbreviated version

MCP Spirited

- T-shirts, polo shirts, sweatshirts, sweaters, and jackets may be worn during the school day with MCP logo.
- Spirit Wear can be purchased from: missionprep.org, Shop tab, 'MCP Spirit Wear' Shirt
- T-Shirts (Crew neck and V-Neck) are allowed - as long as there are no graphics. Plain, prints, or small logos 3" or less are allowed. Long or short sleeved collared shirts are acceptable including flannels and plaids.

Skirts, dresses, and shorts

- Skirts, dresses and shorts (Bermuda-style shorts are okay) must be no higher than three inches above the knee. **Note:** The only acceptable shorts are those with belt loops.
- Dresses must have sleeves.

Slacks, pants

- All pants must be neat and properly fitting.
- Leggings/jeggings may NOT be worn but are acceptable under a skirt or dress of proper length.

Footwear

- Footwear must be worn at all times.
- Sandal-type footwear must have a back strap.
- Flip-flops, house slippers, or athletic sandals are not permitted.

Dress Code

The following is NOT acceptable attire at MCP

- Clothing that is too tight or loose
- Baggy pants or shorts
- Pants or shorts that have holes or patches
- Any clothing that exposes underwear or midriff
- Clothing that is sheer or is inappropriately revealing
- Athletic shorts or swim trunks
- Spaghetti straps, tank tops, halter tops, crop tops or tube tops
- Military-style fatigues
- Sweatpants, yoga pants, pajamas, and overalls
- Torn, cut, or frayed clothing, or clothing with holes

Hair

Hairstyles should always be clean, neatly trimmed, well groomed, and natural in color. Extreme hairstyles (Mohawks, mullets, etc.) are not permitted. Hair dyeing of unnatural colors is not allowed. Boys must be cleanly shaven at all times or will be required to shave. Sideburns must not extend more than one half inch below the bottom of the ear.

Headgear/Sunglasses

Hoods and hats are not to be worn anytime in the building, outside during school hours or at indoor sporting events. Sunglasses may not be worn inside the building. COVID-19 protocols may require students to wear masks while on campus.

Mass Dress Philosophy: Professional and Respectful

MCP believes that it is important for students to experience wearing appropriate formal attire, for religious and professional occasions.

Women

- Dresses or skirts are to be knee length or longer (no slits)
- Clothing that is sheer or are inappropriately revealing is not permitted
- Dresses must have sleeves or a sweater/cardigan must be worn over it all day
- Dresses must be modest and may not be low cut or show any cleavage
- Dress slacks are permitted
- Dress shoes or sandals with a back-strap are required
- Athletic looking shoes of any type are NOT considered dress shoes
- Sweatshirts or zip hoodies may not be worn

Men

- Dress shirt (tucked in all day)
- No polo shirtsTie (to be tied all day)
- Tie (to be tied all day)
- Dress pants with a belt
- Hard-soled leather dress shoes
- Athletic looking shoes of any type are NOT considered dress shoes
- Sweatshirts or zip hoodies may not be worn

LUNCH*

Mission College Prep has an active cafeteria for our students, Café Royale, which serves both break and lunch every day. MCP is a closed campus, so students can either bring food from home or buy food from Fresh Fare, operated by Kristen and Andy Schulz. MCP Café Royale is cashless and all families using the cafe must open an account. Fresh Fare is separate from MCP. The smallest account denomination accepted is \$50 as a check or Venmo (@Kristen-Schulz-4). For more information please visit the MCP website.

Families can pay tuition annually, semi-annually or monthly; if paying monthly, the first tuition payment is due in July and the last in April. 
