Student Learning:

Grade 1/2/3 - For the month of November students have been learning about poetry. The grade 3's have been trying their hand at limerick poems. Students are practicing lots throughout the week on new spelling and sight words. The 2's and 3's have been writing with more adjectives. Grade 1's and 2's have been learning about numbers; comparing and skip counting. The 3's have dove right into addition and subtraction up to 1000. We are wrapping up our Energy unit in science but will continue on computer science throughout the year which has to do with giving instructions to a person or computer and having them complete it and end up at a given point. Students have created beautiful painted Christmas trees along with cute snowmen for our door decoration. I encourage them to continue reading at home to help strengthen their fluency and comprehension skills at school!

Grade 4/5/6 - Students have been continuing with their spelling words and will begin their novel study on Harry Potter as soon as the books arrive! We have been focusing on reading comprehension, and will continue working on this skill. Students are wrapping up Earth Systems in Science and Place Value in Math and are set to begin Matter and Addition/Subtraction. In Art, we will be learning about colour theory and use that knowledge to make winter themed projects.

Staff Professional Learning: Our staff has engaged in a variety of learning opportunities over the past month. Ms. Miller updated her Violent Threat Risk Assessment training. Our staff worked on student engagement, pedagogy, Indigenous learning pieces, and use of AI tools at our November staff Professional Learning. We attended the ATA PD Day and learned about cardio drumming, heard from Inuit spokesperson Gouta Desmarais about her experiences with intergenerational trauma and the social assistance system, as well as Keynote speaker David Allison and his talk about Values. Mrs. Huppertz also attended a specialized math session hosted by Buffalo Trail. Upcoming, our teachers will be working for a full day each into our Innovation Coaches on a variety of pedagogy pieces including AI, planning, Mathology, and critical thinking instruction.

Staffing Update: Mrs. Sacha has returned to her teaching role. We wish Mrs. Olsen all the best and thank her for everything she contributed to our school during her time here.

Music Programming: We are working on arranging Piano lessons for following the winter break. Our Music program is working on a special presentation with our traditional Christmas Concert.

Sports: Senior High girls volleyball is wrapping up. We had a fun game between the teachers and the senior girls and they will have a wind up and play their parents the first week in December.

Basketball Club for Grades 4-9 will be starting up.

International Trip: In the coming weeks a survey will be sent out to families of students who will be in Grades 9-12 in Spring 2027 asking for preference in regards to our trip. We are in contact with EF Tours and awaiting quotes and information about available tours.

Islander of the Week: Our school has chosen to recognize weekly on the last day of the week an "Islander of the Week". These students will be nominated by persons in our school community for showing behaviors and efforts that enhance our welcoming, safe, and caring environment.
