**INTRODUCTION**

Articles should be written in English with good and correct *grammar*. It must be translated into good English with the maximum length of 8 pages of single spaced (pictures, tables and references are not included) Times New Roman font format size 12, 1 space, Justify, on A4 paper, 1 columns. Normal margins with a maximum outcome number of pages is 15. Articles should not be numbered. Please set your margins before you type your article by looking at the settings of this template page. Incorrect formatting will result in your article submission being returned to us. If you have any questions about formatting, please send a message to [kijms@unkris.ac.id](mailto:kijms@unkris.ac.id)

New paragraphs are written indented - *first* line 0.75 cm, with no space between paragraphs. The introduction is written in one chapter without subtitles. The entire presentation in the article is written in *essay* form so there is no numerical or alphabetical format that separates between chapters or sections, or to mark new chapters or sections. For this reason, if there are parts of the article content that require numbering or bullet lists, make them into flowing paragraphs as follows: The introduction consists of: (1) background or reason for the research, (2) literature review, (3) problem formulation, and (4) purpose of the writing. The presentation in the introduction should clearly and sharply explain the *state of art*, *research gaps*, and objectives of the article discussed. Primary literature suggested of the latest published article (5th last)

Any direct or indirect quotations from books should be cited in the text and the source listed in the bibliography. In-text citations are written like this: (Author's last name, year: page) or (Author's last name, year) for book sources like this (Kasmir, 2022); citations that come from the work of an institution should mention the acronym of the institution concerned, for example, (IAI 2022). Meanwhile, citations for *online* sources are written like this: (Last name of author/editor/institution, year of posting) like this with one author (Hermawan 2022); with two

authors (Siregar and Utama 2022); more than two authors (Fitriany et al. 2022). Avoid writing citations Mulyana (2000, 56) in Rafiqi (2015, 23).

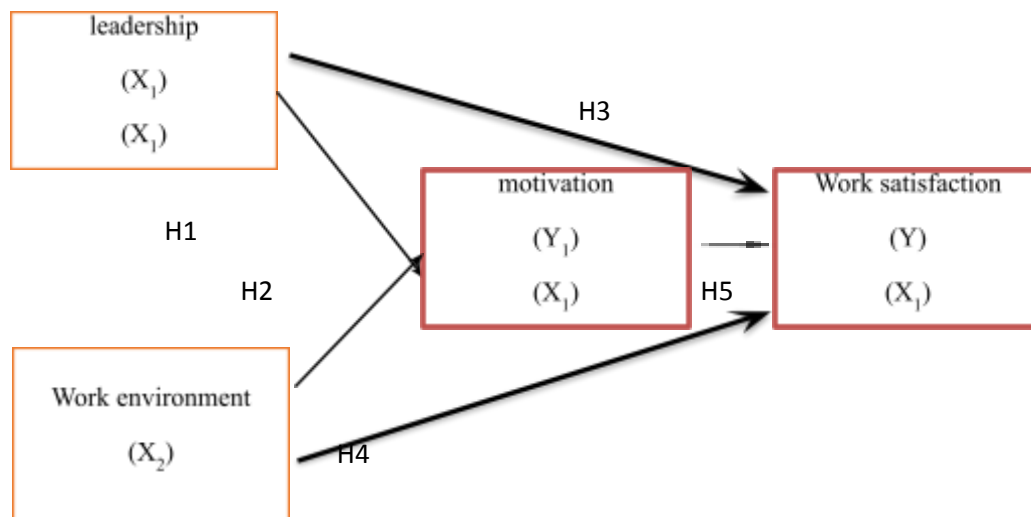
## LITERATURE

Literature review articles contain an analysis and commentary of the publications on a specific area of research (latest trends 10 years). In larger subject areas, the review may point to significant works in that topic. However, new and emergent areas might have a small enough body of knowledge to be covered in its entirety. The purpose of the literature review article is to describe the general state or condition of the topic under consideration and to analyze and critique the latest trends and developments in that topic.

## METHODS

This section describes the type of research (quantitative or qualitative or mix method) subjects and objects of research (population and sample), analysis unit, validity, reliability and method analysis, followed by time and location of research, research instruments, frame work research (in the form of a flowchart of research, sampling methods, data collection techniques, operational definitions of research variables, and analysis techniques. ## RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

The result only explains research results based on research framework.

Research results are the results of empirical research or theoretical studies that are written systematically, critically analyzed, and informative. The discussion of the results is argumentative regarding the relevance between the results, theory, previous research and empirical facts found, and shows the novelty of the findings.

The discussion is about the integration between results and previous researches (whether there is similarities or differences). The author compiles, analyzes, evaluates, interprets and compares the results of the author's findings with the findings of existing research (*previous results*). The author must pay attention to the consistency of the article from the title to the bibliography.

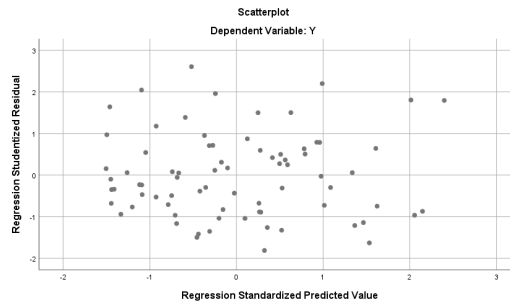
Data analysis processes such as statistical calculations do not need to be presented. Only the results of the analysis need to be reported. Tables or figures can be used to clarify the verbal presentation of research results.

Tables or figures are presented in the form of a stand-alone table, JPEGs are not allowed from original article. Tables or figures are presented with sufficient explanation and include a number and title. The number and title of the table are placed above the table, while the number and title of the figure are placed below the figure. Tables only need horizontal lines in the heading and closing sections (3-line system), vertical lines are not required. Complete the tables and figures by writing the source under each table/ figure. The words Table 1 and Figure 1 must be bolded and centered. Example of a table:

## CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATION

Conclusions is written in a form of narration. The content of the conclusion should be an answer to the problem and research objectives as well as the limitations of research, or it can also produce a theory or concept based on existing facts and analysis. The conclusion is

presented in one paragraph, not points, and is not expressed in statistical sentences. New findings can be in the form of theories, postulates, formulas, rules, methods, models, prototypes, or equivalent. The conclusion must be supported by sufficient research data. The conclusion can be complemented by a paragraph of research suggestions. While the recommendation contains implications and suggestions..

## **LITERATURE**

It is expected to cite from the up to date journals at least the last 5 years journal with the composition of 70%. The writing should follow APA style.

The bibliography is sorted alphabetically, without sequential numbers, and is not separated between book, online, and other sources. Authors suggested use reference management software such as Mendeley, EndNote or Zotero in preparing the bibliography. Reference sources are prioritized for the maximum of the last 5 years with the composition of Primary references (Journal Articles) 80% of the total references. The bibliography is written using the APA (*American Psychological Association*) citation system, Times New Roman 12 font, Space 1.
