#Study abroad must be completed in a French speaking country on a department-approved program. Exceptions to the semester study abroad requirement may be made on a case-by-case basis in a petition to the department and in consultation with a department academic advisor. Language-intensive replacements may include a year living in a French theme house, intensive summer study, etc.

##Seniors must work with their advisor in the French and Francophone Studies department to create an ePortfolio about their progress in the curriculum and total experience as a major; to be submitted to the department by April 15 of senior year.

###All French Comparative Literature majors must submit a senior paper to the department by April 15 of their senior year. Details available on the department homepage.
