## THE MYTH OF SISYPHUS BY ALBERT CAMUS

Albert Camus wrote about this after-war feeling of disorientation and related it to a Greek myth. Sisyphus is remembered more for his punishment in the underworld than for what he did in his life. According to the Greek myth, Sisyphus is condemned to roll a rock up to the top of a mountain, only to have the rock roll back down to the bottom every time he reaches the top. Then he does it all again. The gods figured that an eternity of futile labor is a terrible punishment. To Camus, this myth related heavily to everyday life, and he saw Sisyphus as an "absurd" hero, with a pointless existence.
