<u>This is a digital exam</u>. This means you will not have a traditional answer sheet or booklet in any manner. All of your prompts and responses will be done through the Bluebook Application. You do not need to bring pens, pencils, sharpener, or any other associated materials with you, but may want them if you decide to write any notes on scratch paper. What does the school provide for this AP Exam?

- Scratch paper.
- Clock students are responsible for pacing themselves (For Digital and Hybrid tests, Bluebook also includes a built-in timer)
- Water and snacks (chips, cookies, granola bars, hard candy) for the break. Students may not bring their own food or drink. For those with a special dietary need, please see Mr. Hall BEFORE Spring Break.

What Do I need to bring to this AP Exam?

- Your FULLY CHARGED CHROMEBOOK.
- Your Chromebook charger.
- School ID just in case a proctor doesn't know you personally.
- Sweatshirt/sweater rooms can be cold
- Your own no. 2 pencils (with erasers)
- Your own pen(s) with black or dark blue ink only
- Watch that does not connect to the internet, beep or make noise, or have an alarm (NO SMART WATCHES).

What can I NOT BRING to this exam?

- Smart watches or any other electronic equipment. If you bring your cell phone, it must be **POWERED OFF** and given to the proctor until the exam period is over. Your phone cannot be accessed in a break and will remain secured until you are completed with the test and leave the testing room.
- Smart glasses of any kind are not allowed in the testing room. If you bring these into the testing room, it will result in a test cancellation by the College Board.
- Food or drink; this is a College Board requirement For students with a **special dietary need**, please see Mr. Hall ASAP as snacks will be purchased over Spring Break.
- Clothing or shoes with subject-related information
- Anything else ex. no earplugs, no highlighters, no colored pens, no whiteout, etc.
- Please leave bags and other items at home, locker, or vehicle. Your bag cannot be accessed during a break and will remain secured until you complete the test.

What are the break(s) for this exam?

With the exception of AP Seminar (which is not offered at MHS), there are two Sections to each exam, with a 10 minute break between each section. Some sections have more than one part, but there is no break between the parts within a section. Ex: If your test has a Section 1, Part A and a Section 1, Part B, there is no break between Part A and Part B. There WILL be a break between Section 1, Part B and anything in Section 2.

What time can I expect to finish this exam?

If you are completing the regular test without any testing accommodations, the *estimated time* to complete this specific AP Exam (this does vary by exam, so your other exams may have different times) is: **11:45**

Attendance Policies for AP Testing:

You will have an excused absence for the entire day so long as you report for this AP Test. Attendance will be reported to Mrs. Pizano after the test begins. Please remember you are responsible for making-up any work from your other classes. ***Please note: This exam occurs on an Early Release Day for MHS, so the regular class day will end at 11:15. As such, you MUST arrange for your own transportation as there will not be a late bus on this day.

General Information for AP Testing:

- 1. If you decide to not take an AP Test, please complete the Exam Refund Request form on the <u>main page</u>. The College Board will keep a \$40 fee for each unused test, but if you decide not to take a test, you can receive a partial refund of \$59. If you paid a late registration fee, no part of that fee will be refunded by the College Board.
- 2. You must report to the exam room on time. The College Board sets the times for each AP Exam and we have no flexibility. Late arrivals will not be allowed to test.
- 3. If you finish early, you may NOT go to the next section early, or submit your test early (on paper, or digitally); you must wait for the end of the section/test.
 - a. Exception: If you have a testing accommodation that affords you longer breaks, extra breaks, or additional time, you MAY end your test during the additional time window. For example, if a section of the test is timed at 1 hour and your testing accommodation allows you 1.5 hours, then you may end that section anywhere between 1 hour and 1.5 hour mark. No matter your accommodation, once you end a part of the test (either digitally or on paper), you may NOT return to that part.
