Ways You Might Use This

Below is a list of various ways you might use the ideas in this document and the accompanying resources for different types of professional learning.

Learning Experience	Time Frame	Brief Description of Activity Example
Asynchronous Study	1+ weeks	Use a technology platform that allows for several ways to have access and share your ideas. (For example, Padlet allows for verbal, written, and visual expression.) Have a once-a-week question to discuss after posting a resource.
Blended Learning	2-3 weeks	Run the 5Es model on the one-pager, allowing for group discussion during the facilitated seminar. Suggestion: Use an LMS like Schoology to keep discussions and information centralized. *Each of the E's of the one-pager should take approximately 30 min to 1 hour.
Choice Board PD	1hour -1 week	Using the resources in the toolkit, create a <u>professional learning</u> <u>choice board</u> to personalize the learning for teachers.
Collaborative Consultancy	1- 3 hours	After providing professional learning on coaching students, provide teachers an opportunity to share their challenges in giving feedback or initiating challenging conversations using the consultancy protocol to help teachers collaborative problem solve.
Collective Wisdom: Make/Take or Practice Sessions	1-2 hours	For communication to parents and students, invite teachers to bring their best communication ideas. If hard copy resources are needed, have them bring enough for every person present to make a template. This is a share-out of ideas. Review either "How can we address challenging conversations and maintain professional relationships?" in the recorded webinar or slide presentation. Survey teachers beforehand on topics or scenarios they've witnessed or experienced on this topic. Either in small groups or with partners make teachers action plans.
Coaching Resources	10 min +	As needs arise, use resources in the toolkit independently based on needs.

Learning Experience	Time Frame	Brief Description of Activity Example
FlipGrid Forums	5 min	Use ideas from this page to spark ideas on how teachers can use FlipGrid in Professional Development. Read an article or watch a video from the toolkit at the end of a meeting (i.e. PLC, staff meeting), pose a question, and have teachers reflect their ideas on FlipGrid. Use FlipGrid as a reflection tool on the one-pager.
Gallery Walk	30 min +	Do a gallery walk to receive feedback and enliven discussions on final deliverables for each of the subcategories. Instead of the reflections on coaching students and feedback/challenging conversations with colleagues, use one of the strategies from the resources to develop a plan of questions and language in anticipation of the student coaching or colleague dialogue.
In-Person: Full Day	6 hours	 Facilitate the 5Es from the one-pager but use protocols and small group discussions for exploring and extending sections. Final end of the day deliverable to share (i.e. newsletter, email) As part of the final deliverable, roll play coaching conversations between teacher and student using Fishbowl protocol. As part of the final deliverable, roll play feedback or challenging conversations between colleagues using Fishbowl protocol.
*In-Person: Drop-In Sessions	20 min	Survey staff of the top three guiding questions from the toolkit. Create a drop-in session to read a resource and discuss. Use a catchy title like Tuesday Tips
*Module	1 hour	A module of a sub-category in the toolkit. This can be asynchronous sessions in person or on a virtual platform like Zoom, Google Meet, or Teams. For this asynchronously, participants watch the webinar recording and have a discussion on a common space like Jamboard, Schoology, or Padlet.
*PD on the Potty	5 min	Choose a guiding question or one of the resources from the toolkit to share information about communication and advertise upcoming PD. For more ideas, check out <u>PD on the Potty - Professional Learning as you find Relief</u> QR Codes work great for this.



Learning Experience	Time Frame	Brief Description of Activity Example
*Podcast Topics	5+ min	Create short podcasts highlighting main points for guiding question resources in the toolkit or specific articles, videos, and podcasts. Invite guests to talk about this topic. Keep the podcasts short and create a playlist. Link the source in the podcast description.
*Twitter Slow Chat	5+ min	Use the guiding questions in each sub-category as questions for the chat. Invite teachers to share a takeaway from one of the resources connected to each guiding question in the chat.
