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Another 'BIG' thank you must be extended to all the families who have continued to support our ongoing commitment to embedding First Nations cultures and perspectives throughout our school and wider community.

Our year began with our Inaugural F.I.R.E Carrier Commissioning Ceremony. This was a significant event for our school that officially recognised and empowered our newest F.I.R.E Carrier Leaders, highlighting their commitment to teaching others about reconciliation.

Another foundational achievement later in the year was the creation of our school's first Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP). This crucial document officially formalises our dedication to reconciliation, providing a clear pathway and framework for future initiatives and learning.

We also saw a wonderful new level of engagement as each learning community celebrated a liturgy to coincide with a special event on the Indigenous calendar. This initiative was a powerful way to embed cultural awareness and First Nations spirituality directly into our Catholic faith.

I'm sure many would agree, a stand-out event this year was again our 'Grandparents Hour' in honour of NAIDOC Week. Reflecting the 2025 Theme, 'The Next Generation: Strength, Vision & Legacy,' it was inspiring to see our students' grandparents and special elders sharing their hopes and dreams for them.

Finally, our 'Great Book Swap'! Owing to the enormous generosity of the school community, not only did every student again have the opportunity to take a book home, but as a community, we raised an incredible \$350—surpassing 2023's total! This money will directly help fund Literacy resources for children in the Tiwi Islands.
