The primary issue arising is the miscategorization of massage as personal service rather than healthcare.
 Choose a few or all of the topics to write about: Massage therapy in Nebraska is a <i>licensed healthcare profession</i> and Nebraska does not tax healthcare. Personal anecdote of massage therapy as healthcare Massage therapy is the only profession listed in this bill that is covered by health insurance. Nebraska massage therapy is covered by the VA, Medicare Advantage, Flex, HSA, Personal Injury, Workman's Comp, and many insurance plans. Massage therapy is listed as a therapy to help the opioid epidemic in a letter signed by Nebraska's Attorney General to the American Health Insurance Plans. Like all other healthcare professions, massage therapy has its own Practice Act, as opposed to the personal services this bill, and others, have lumped massage with.
I conclude by asking you to strike massage from this bill. In Nebraska we do not tax healthcare services; and as you can see, in Nebraska, Massage Therapy is an important healthcare profession. Taxing a health service is not only bad policy but contradicts Nebraska healthcare policies.
