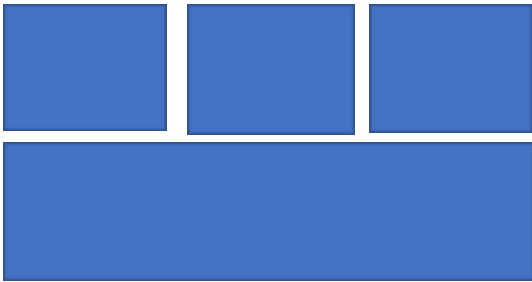


**Draft 1: Write out your story (NO ART IN THIS DRAFT)**

- 1) zoom in on a car speeding by
- 2) zoom out to show another car catching up to the first car
- 3) cars start to go around a bend
- 4) 1 car crashes and the other pulls ahead
- 5) ending – zoom out further and see that it is a child playing with toy cars

**Draft 2: Edit your story and then draw out what you want your panel layout to look like.** Big panels reflect important moments. Panels that are crooked or collide represent fighting or chaos.

- 1) zoom in on a car speeding by
- 2) zoom out to show another car catching up to the first car
- ~~3) cars start to go around a bend~~ (removed this part because it was unnecessary)
- 4) 1 car crashes and the other pulls ahead (might need to make 2 panels - 1 showing the crash and another showing the car pass the crash)
- 5) ending – zoom out further and see that it is a child playing with toy cars
