# What should you do if you have a car accident?

If you have a traffic accident, you must:

# • Stop at once(1)

Stop at the accident scene or as close as possible without creating a dangerous situation. If you don't stop, you are committing a serious traffic crime called "<u>Hit and run</u>"(2). If the accident is on the highway, you have no injury, and it is safe to drive your vehicle, move your vehicle to the <u>shoulder(3)</u> of the highway or to a parking area.

### Give help

Give any <u>reasonable(3)</u> help to an <u>injured(4)</u> person. In many cases, an injured person should not be moved at all except by someone who is trained. If a person is killed or unconscious, the driver is required to remain at the <u>scene(5)</u> of the accident until the police arrive.

# Exchange information

Give to the other driver, passengers in the vehicle, or any <a href="mailto:injured(6">injured(6)</a> pedestrian(7) your:

- Name
- Address
- o Driver license number
- Vehicle license plate number and
- Your insurance information

You must provide this information to the other driver(s) unless you think it will be dangerous or impossible to do so.

#### Report the accident to <u>DMV(8)</u>

You must report the accident to the DMV by filling in a form if:

- Damage(9) to the vehicle you were driving is over \$1,500;
- Damage to any vehicle is over \$1,500 and any vehicle is towed from the scene as a result of damages from this accident;
- o Injury or death resulted from this accident; or
- Damages to any one person's property(10) other than a vehicle is over \$1,500.

You must <u>file(11)</u> a report even if your vehicle was the only one in the crash. Before you file an accident report, always make a copy of the report.

#### Also, know that:

- Some drivers who are in accidents offer to fix the damage and try to get the other driver not to file a report. If you agree, you are breaking the law (if the damage is more than \$1,500).
- If you hit an <u>unoccupied(12)</u> vehicle, try to find the owner. If you cannot find the owner, leave a note with your name and address and a short description of what happened.
- o If you damage property other than a motor vehicle, you also must try to find the owner or someone in charge of(13) the property to report the damage.
