- Understand education and pathway planning (including IEPs, modifications, and goal setting)
- Connect with community agencies and resources for post-secondary planning
- Build the confidence and tools needed to help your child navigate school, work, and life after graduation

We know that transitions can be complex — but you're not alone. Together, we'll learn how to create strong plans, strengthen student voice, and make sure no opportunity is missed.
