GRAMMAR – *It will + weather*

To talk about the weather, we use the pronoun 'it' and 'there' to refer to 'the weather'. When talking about simple predictions of weather in the future tense, we use the structure:

It will + verb = the weather that will happen in the future

Ex. It will rain tomorrow.

It will be + adjective = a description of the weather

Ex. It will be sunny tomorrow morning.

There will be + noun = predictions with weather nouns

Ex. There will be a blizzard next Monday.
