STRENGTHENING THE LONGEVITY OF WOMEN'S RIGHTS

The General Assembly,

Reiterating the importance of the CEDAW,

Encouraging female affiliation within educational systems,

Recognizing the effects of the social, political, cultural stigmas and stereotypes on women,

Enforcing females attend school and have equal access as compared to males,

Eradicating female violence based on gender,

Incorporating destigmatizing, consent, and sex education and women's studies into educational systems,

Enforcing the actions of this commission

- 1) Holds summits to fill the holes within CEDAW
 - a) Every 6 months summit will be held between General Assembly and 3 women's rights advocacy groups from one country of the countries within Asia, Africa, and the Middle East will fly out to each summit
 - b) Member states submit reports semi-annually, written by unbiased UN Officials
 - c) World Bank will fund plane rides
 - d) ECOSOC will monitor the progress of our meetings
- 2) Implements the Project E²
 - a) Focuses on education and encouraging the society to support women's rights
- 3) Integrates women's study into primary and secondary schools
 - a) Students, mainly males, will be taught that the social, political, and cultural stigmas are morally incorrect.

- b) Children will learn the importance of women's empowerment and be educated on the vitality of women's affiliation
- 4) Incorporates Sex and Consent Education in primary and secondary schools
 - a) Sex education for both genders can help improve overall international women's health
 - b) Consent education for both genders can help improve overall international women's protection and eliminate stigmas that promote silence in gender based violence
- 5) Emphasizes economic funding to NGOs and aid to women in developing countries
 - a) Funding from World Bank
 - b) Equally split between NGOs and developing countries
 - c) Encourages women to invest in women's' education for the interest of the women and the economy
- 6) Hosts a seminar paired up with the International African Committee where men will attend and undergo exercises where they are placed in the shoes of women and experience the repercussions of their actions.
