Indspire Post-Secondary Education Program

Full and part time studies in college, university, skilled trades, apprenticeships, and technology programs. There is one application for all of Indspire's bursaries, scholarships, and awards (with a few exceptions that you'll see below). You only need to complete the application once to be considered for all applicable bursaries, scholarships, and awards. *Application Deadlines: August 1, November 1, and February 1.*

Bursaries and Scholarships

John Wesley Beaver Awards

- Indigenous students pursuing programs with a potential to lead to a career in the electricity/energy industry with a focus on Engineering, Science & Technology

Bruce Power Indigenous Post-Secondary Scholarship

 The Building Brighter Futures Indigenous Post-Secondary Award, which provides \$4,000 to local Indigenous students who have completed at least one year of postsecondary education or apprenticeship programs.

Hydro One Awards Scholarship

- This award is granted annually to students studying in the energy industry related disciplines at a recognized university or community college. In addition to a cash award, recipients will be offered a paid work term/summer position with Hydro One.

Canada Post Aboriginal Incentive Award

- Canada Post gives \$2,000 grants to Indigenous Peoples who have renewed their educational learning. You're eligible to apply if you:
 - Are a Canadian and a member of a First Nation, Métis or Inuit community
 - Have been out of school for 1 year or more and are returning
 - Have already returned to school and completed 1 full year of studies

The Joseph Poitras Métis Bursary Fund has been established in recognition of Joseph's strong advocacy for educational opportunities for Métis youth. This bursary is available for a Métis who has demonstrated both financial need and a desire to improve their life or employability through additional education or training programmes. It is not restricted to high school students and has no upper age limits.

Ontario First Generation Bursary

The Ontario First Generation Bursary is for postsecondary students whose parents have never attended post secondary studies.

Applicants Must:

- Have financial needs.
- Attend a publicly-assisted college or university in Ontario only.

Ontario Non-Profit Housing Association

Scholarship Application - Kathleen Blinkhorn Aboriginal Student Scholarship

Each year, the Ontario Non-Profit Housing Association offers five scholarships of \$2,000 to Indigenous students who reside in non-profit housing in Ontario. This funding is available to help Indigenous students with their post-secondary education costs including tuition, books, technology, and transportation.

Helen Bassett Commemorative Student Award • Native Women's Association of Canada

- Indigenous women, Two-Spirit, or gender-diverse peoples pursuing post-secondary studies, (priority given to those in law or related fields) from each of the four directions: North, South, East, and West. Applications due by July 16th.

Michael Melancon-Koffend Student Award • Native Women's Association of Canada

- young Indigenous women, Two-Spirit, or gender-diverse students from each province and territory. Applications due by July 2nd.

Nellie Makokis Carlson Commemorative Student Award • Native Women's Association of Canada

- Indigenous single mothers, two-spirited or gender diverse persons, attending a post-secondary institute. Applications due by July 9.

TD Scholarship for Indigenous Peoples

Together with AFOA Canada, a not-for-profit led by Indigenous Peoples, 25 scholarships are available to be awarded annually, worth up to \$60K over 4 years.

Women in Mining-Indigenous Trailblazer Award

- Candidates can either be nominated or self-nominate for the Award.
- Nominees must be women
- Nominees must be Indigenous (First Nation, Inuit or Métis).
- Nominators and Nominees do not need to be a member of Women in Mining Canada
- Current Women in Mining Canada board members are not eligible, nor are previous winners of the Indigenous Trailblazer Award. Winners of other awards in the Trailblazer Awards Series are eligible, provided they meet all other criteria.

TC Energy Scholarship

In support of Indigenous students (First Nation, Métis, Inuit or Non-Status) pursuing any full-time, post-secondary program at a registered education institute, the TC Energy Program offers scholarships to students in three categories which include 77 scholarships specifically for Indigenous students. Some examples include:

- TC Energy Indigenous Legacy Scholarship worth \$5,000
- TC Energy Community Leaders Scholarship worth \$2,500
- TC Energy Trades Scholarship worth \$2,500.

Elementary Teachers' Federation of Ontario

ETFO offers this bursary annually to First Nations, Métis and Inuit women who are entering a publicly-funded faculty of education or ETFO FNMI women members who are taking a qualification/upgrading course from a publicly-funded university/institution. Up to four bursaries of up to \$1,250 and a certificate of recognition may be granted. This award is not intended to support a master's or doctorate program.

Awards & Scholarships

Living and Learning Grant

Individuals who were in Extended Society Care and other youth 21-24 years old who left the care of a Children's Aid Society may be eligible for a Living and Learning Grant. This grant provides additional funds above the regular full-time OSAP aid limits.

The RBC Future Launch Scholarship for Indigenous Youth will award 20 scholarships annually valued up to \$10,000 each per year (up to 4 years) to First Nations. Inuit and Métis students across Canada demonstrating strong academic performance and community involvement.

Eligibility

- Students who self-identify as Status Indian*, a Non-Status Indian, Inuit or Métis
- Applied or currently attending an accredited post-secondary institution in Canada
- Maintain a full course load that leads to a recognized degree, certificate or diploma
- You have shown strong potential to successfully complete the post-secondary program
- You require financial assistance to pursue your education
- You are not an RBC employee or a dependent of an RBC employee
