Explainer (describe the issue):

Each year, Congress passes funding bills (called "appropriations legislation") to fund the federal government for the upcoming fiscal year, which starts October 1. While Republicans hold a slim majority of both houses, those majorities aren't large enough to pass this legislation without the vote of Democratic congress members. Because funding bills must secure 60 votes in the Senate to proceed, Democrats have real leverage in this fight. Congress must pass a funding bill by September 30th or a government shutdown will ensue. Since passing a regular appropriations bill is a unlikely given the upcoming deadline and the need for extensive negotiations, a short-term fix called a "Continuing Resolution" will likely be used to fund the government temporarily while bipartisan negotiations on appropriations continue. However, Continuing Resolutions also require 60 Senate votes to proceed.

A shutdown would be devastating – and Republicans know that. During shutdowns, crucial programs and services are frozen and non-essential federal workers are furloughed without pay for the duration of the shutdown. Republicans are using the threat of a shutdown as a bargaining chip to compel Democrats to accept a garbage deal.

Because Republicans cannot pass a Continuing Resolution without Democratic votes, Democrats must use their leverage and demand that the bill contain meaningful provisions, such as undoing funding rescissions and inserting language to refuse further White House efforts to take over spending authority.

Call to Action (what specific action are we taking):

We are calling our Federal Senators and Representatives to demand that the FY 2026 Continuing Resolution legislation MUST include Democratic priorities such as undoing funding rescissions and reversing draconian Medicaid cuts.. Democrats must not vote for any bill that does not include those priorities simply to avoid a government shutdown. Democrats should further demand that the CR does NOT include the SAVE Act, which would create unnecessary barriers to voting, particularly for seniors, students, rural voters, and potentially married women or others who have changed their last names since birth.
