ACHIEVE GOAL Academic Goal for ELA, Math, Science, and Social Studies
By the end of the 2025-26 school year, the ELA/Math/Science/Social Studies departments will increase each grade level cohort's number of students scoring Mastery and Advance by 10%, as evidenced by the change in the number of students that scored Mastery and Advance on the 2024-25 LEAP assessment.
How will we improve?
Evidence-Based Strategies To achieve this goal, teachers will use research-based strategies such as daily bellringers that help students review key skills and prepare for upcoming lessons.
Activities Students will regularly work in collaborative groups, engage in peer discussions, and give and receive feedback to deepen their understanding. In addition, frequent reviews of LEAP academic vocabulary will support students in mastering subject-specific language essential for success.
GROW GOAL Academic Goal for ELA and Math
By the end of the 2025-26 school year, the ELA and Math departments will grow 50% of our students in the bottom 25% and the ELP population on the 2026 LEAP assessment.
How will we improve?
Evidence-Based Strategies To achieve a 50% growth in the bottom 25% and ELP students on the 2026 LEAP assessment, the ELA and Math departments will implement evidence-based strategies such as data-driven instruction, high-impact tutoring, scaffolded lessons, and targeted language support.
Activities Regular formative assessments, differentiated instruction, small-group interventions, and consistent monitoring of student progress through PLCs. Teachers will receive ongoing coaching and training, while ELP students will benefit from explicit vocabulary instruction and culturally responsive teaching. Success will be measured by growth data, intervention progress, and instructional fidelity.
