BIOGRAPHICAL STATEMENT

Lillian Mottern is a 24-year-old writer from Eastside Los Angeles, now based in New York City. She holds an MFA in Playwriting from Columbia University. At age 17 she was mentored by musical theatre writer Stephen Schwartz, during which time she began to immerse herself in theatre writing. Soon after, Lillian joined the selective North Hollywood-based playwrights' and artists' group, New Works Lab, headed by Andrew Shafer, where she continued to develop her voice and built a community of artistic collaborators and peers. She was also involved in the playwriting workshop that came out of Padua, headed by Roxanne Rogers and Wes Walker. Lillian moved to New York after finishing her undergraduate degree at UCLA where she served as the Editor-in-Chief of the university's literary journal *Westwind*. She currently writes plays, screenplays, and short fiction. Her influences are Joan Didion, Sam Shepard, and Chekhov, and she is deeply interested in the interplay between theater and film and literature. She currently co-curates a reading series in downtown Manhattan called Night Mare which deals with writing based in the absurd and surreal, and is editor-in-chief of the alt lit magazine, *Verdict*. Her play *Moonshiner* received an industry reading at Bold Elephant in London in 2025, and will be produced by Adult Film in 2026.
