Brisk offers batch grading according to a rubric, but you have to purchase the expensive district license to have access. Looking to see if there is anything free out there...

What are your favorite AI tools? And how do you use them?

- Brisk and the batch feedback feature
 - Brisk for providing feedback for student writing
 - Claude - coding embeddable web pages or online activities
 - Google Gemini seems to be the best and fastest for image creation and modification. I'll upload our school's mascot and Gemini will create specific icons and logos for events. For example, a newspaper club I sponsored, Gemini took the exact logo and had it reading a newspaper in space. It is also great for taking pre-existing images and making small modifications to them with text and formatting.
 - Microsoft Co-Pilot for designing things for me as an instructor. Adobe Express AI for students to work with AI in a safe manner.
 - NotebookLM's Interactive Podcast feature is mind-blowing
 - a controlled
 - SchoolAI- create custom Chatbots for students (Spaces)
 - Gems in Gemini to automate/streamline content creation processes as well as deliver Generative Simulations for students to interact with.
 - Co-Pilot and MagicSchool
 - Curipod - interactive student engagement
 - Canva AI to generate infographics and graphic organizers. I use ChatGPT to generate prompts tailored to Canva, then copy and paste it.
 - Adobe Firefly - image generation to create book covers

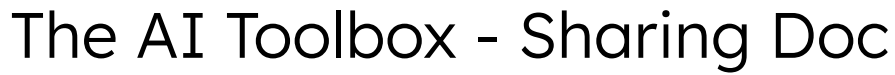

What are your favorite AI tools? And how do you use them?

Magic School AI- I use it for lesson planning, rubric making, adjusting text to match necessary reading levels for students

Brisk: creating and investigating writing

School AI - use it to teach an AI lesson...it allows students to get first hand experience in chatting with AI, but in a more guided and controlled manner. (7th grade)

I second School AI. The teacher guidance & monitoring system is SUPER friendly and helps keep students on task. They love getting real time feedback on the topics that interest them most.

NotebookLM is going to be my go-to resource to create support materials for social studies content. Timelines, summaries, key points, etc. will be great test prep for my kids and help along the way with digesting content.

Magic School AI -differentiated readings for varying reading levels, checking my own produced resources for readability and tone.

Co grader for large amounts of written submissions to auto-grade based on my personalized rubric that provides tailored personalized feedback to students.

Playlab.ai- custom tool creation out of teach for america's re-invention lab. Very high quality output.

EnlightenAI: I use this tool to grade student writing. It provides excellent feedback, and my grading time has been significantly decreased. 😊

Adobe Firefly - Image generator to create art/pictures for use on bulletin boards. I print these with our large poster printer - or on a Roland printer for large display case visuals. Example: Used theme Tech the Halls and had it generate an image of elves decorating santa's workshop with technology instead of Christmas decorations. The kids loved it.

Magic School Science Lesson Generator is AWESOME as a tool for curating quick, effective science demos and labs.

Diffit - excellent for differentiation, level text, reads pdf's for lessons, vocab and more!

Adobe Express- use it to create titles & graphics for television programming

Google AutoDrawbook - it no longer suggests objects while drawing, even when using the magic drawing tool. Any idea what's going on? We tried to use it in class last week and no one could get it to make suggestions.

Can Brisk assess multiple prompts on the same student submission that involves multiple test questions for example?

Multiple grading components have specifications about how the student submissions need to be uploaded or accessed, which alters how we set them up as teachers.

In Brisk, when you monitor the students does it just show the name they put in when they use the code or can you add your student names and roster them?

In Schoolai, can you tailor or pre-load the tutor tool to what you are currently teaching?

What AI tools have you used and how have you used them?

- Curipod- designed very engaging lessons
 - I second this! So fun! Used for lesson delivery with new content.
- Gamma
- Motion AI-auto scheduling app
- Brisk - create DOK questions from slideshows
- Chat GPT - creating functional reading passages and writing prompts at student instructional levels
- Canva AI picture generator - students will give character descriptions to come up with character pictures for their presentations
- Adobe Express- can make your own classroom and push out assignments through AE- create images, videos, slide shows, etc.

I was just chatting with the Giver chatbot on schoolai...Do you avoid spoilers by setting the parameters of the discussion? Maybe a page range if we're not done with the book?

MagicSchool Chatbot: Word vomit into the chatbot when you have to respond to an disgruntled parent and then ask it to help you say that in a polite and respectful way

Brisk USED to allow us to run an AI check on student writing...now you have to pay for it!

MagicSchool Chatbot: Ask chatbot to help me write sentences for vocabulary quizzes with context clues, then randomize the sentences, give me a key and alphabetize my list of vocab words for my word bank.

MagicSchool Writing Feedback tool: first I develop clear prompt and essay requirements; then I can input student work to get feedback on my list of requirements chunked by strengths and weaknesses. Obviously, I review the comments as I actually grade essays but the feedback is usually pretty accurate, well written, and organized.

MagicSchool: input a text or video and ask it to generate discussion questions based on the text/video

Brisk : Are you aware of how to change the theme/format/overall look of the slides Brisk creates in Google Slides?

Which AI tools/sites include pictures e.g. creating a story?

I complete teacher and parent interviews for my position, is there an AI tool that would be able to record our conversation and then summarize it?

- Do I need consent for this?

Being able to write a good prompt that can be put directly into Chat GPT is a useful skill in its own right

Just a fun story - I was attending a webinar PD last week for Economics and the presenter referenced your Control Alt Achieve site and a resource that you had that fit with the topic of the presentation and everyone was raving about you and I was excited to be like HE IS OUR PD SPEAKER THIS YEAR! Everyone else was jealous!

Any AI tool sites that can do graphs for mathematics or economics?

Is there a free AI tool that can translate a pdf file (and keep formatting) from English to Spanish? I can only find paid versions at the moment. Or websites where it only translates text that are copy and paste. Google translate won't work on *scanned* PDFs.

How can you share an assignment you created in Brisk with students? Can you create more than one class in Brisk, so when you assign work, it can be organized by hour? It looks like you can copy a link and send it to students through email or Google Classroom... Do they all need to get the extension? (I created an article with a debate where students take a side and debate with a bot... the bot prompts students to dig deeper and find evidence)

If a youtube video is already added to a google classroom assignment, how do you access Brisk to create a quiz based on said video?

Answer: Right click on video and open it a new tab and the Brisk icon will appear.

Is there an AI tool to assist kids with “speech to text” accommodation that would also support proper punctuation and grammar utilizing their thoughts and ideas?

Are there programs you recommend for goal writing (for IEPs)? I’ve seen it offered on different programs but wasn’t sure if you know what most people use

Is there an AI tool that reads a SCANNED pdf that includes images. (For example, on a science test with a model and a paragraph.

- I tried MagicSchool, but my searches came up empty. Any advice on how to hone in on what prompt to use? (For example, I was looking for two syllable, closed word list and it wasn’t generating a list for me. It was giving me passages with 2 syllable words but not a strict word list. What was I doing wrong?) TY :) [I’ve used chatgpt or gemini for word lists]
- Is there a site or a way to create a digital choice board that provides the actual activities, links, etc. and not just a generated list of ideas that I could put on a choice board (I’m finding a lot of great ideas generated, but I still need to create those activities and create the finished presentation myself... still very time consuming)
- Is there a tool that allows you to level an entire book, or do the tools just level passages/text? Gemini has the largest "Context window"

There is a “paperclip” icon on Brisk where you can upload a PDF

In order to create some of these tools, I have to agree that I trust them to have access to my Google Drive, which also contains identifying information about my students. Can you speak to the reliability of these tools and if I am protecting my students.

All 3 of the sites are very useful and friendly to translate documents into other languages. It was nice to see many languages offered. I see Brisk being very useful for our older grades and newcomers with limited English.

I asked Brisk to create a presentation and lesson plan that included links to videos of particular topics mentioned in the article, and all linked videos were “no longer available.” Is there a way to better request linked content?

Update: I just tried Perplexity as you suggested. It created more like what I was looking for—an outline for a lesson plan with a couple videos linked already that I hadn’t found myself. Thanks!

I used the Magic School IEP Generator to try out what it would do with my input. I was beyond amazed! It took my words and did some rearranging but for the most part said exactly what I said but arranged it into the different areas. The best part was that the annual goal it generated was what I was thinking! It was like getting to sidebar with someone and have them say, “Oh I like that part, but maybe say it this way,” or “No, get rid of that and put this instead.” Love it!!! The end had a list of accommodations, which again allows you to check off the list in your own mind and/or get an idea you weren’t considering. This is an amazing tool to get you started.

Magic School has amazing resources for intervention and differentiation including a “behavior interventions” generator and a “social stories” generator!

I used brisk to create a slide show to teach magnetic/silent e to my first grade students based on a youtube video that I use.

Do you have recommendations for tools that I can use to translate documents into other languages for newcomers that will still keep the format of the original document? Or, it will at least still include pictures from the original and not just be a wall of text. I’m wanting to keep the images on an article, for example, while still translating the words into another language.

Magic School has a “Quote of the Day” generator with whatever topic you type in!!! It will even create activities related to the information.
