

Sandy Hook Promise "Say Something" Program

To: High School, Middle School and K-8 Principals (6th - 12th grade)

SFUSD in partnership with Sandy Hook Promise, is continuing to work together to launch the "Say Something" Anonymous Tip Reporting App.

The "Say Something Program" teaches middle and high school students to recognize the warning signs of someone at-risk of hurting themselves or others and how to say something to a trusted adult to get help. Students can then report these concerns through an app that can be downloaded onto their devices.

Through this app, SFUSD school site and District staff will receive real time concerns and reports from students about potential crises, which will allow district staff to respond quicker and help students in a more timely manner. More Information can be found in this FAQ.

Last Spring, we trained some school site staff to use the app, and asked site administrators to watch a training video as well as complete a form to identify site based teams. We are resuming this work once again, and it is greatly appreciated if you can watch the ~35 min video (if you did not do so last Spring), and please designate school-level team members by **Friday, January 147th. Thank you!**

Next Steps:

- Administrators must watch this introductory training video by January 14th, 2022.
- Principals bring to school CCT to discuss who will be team leads
- Designate 3-5 Staff Members for your School-level Team Leads by January 7th, 2022 by filling out this form.
- *Assistant Principal can be designated as the School-level Team Lead administrator

Timeline:

- By February, 2022:
 - Administrator watches this introductory training video
 - Bring to school CCT to discuss who will be team leads
 - Administrator designates school site team leads by December 9th, 2021 by filling out this form.
 - CCT Leads are trained
 - MS/HS SSWs, Nurses & CHOWs are re-trained on January 14th & January 21st, 2022
- February, 2022
 - First Test Tip is Conducted
 - Students are trained
 - Sandy Hook goes Live with SFUSD
