## ImmTrac2

ImmTrac2 is a Texas Immunization Registry offered by the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) at no cost. It stores student immunization records from multiple sources, such as health departments, primary care providers, and hospitals, in one centralized system. ImmTrac2 is secure and confidential. Only authorized individuals can access the immunization records. Authorized persons include school nurses, health care providers, and health department employees.

Before a child is 18 years old, a parent must provide written consent for his or her child's immunization records to be included in ImmTrac2. Once a child reaches the age of 18, a new consent form must be signed by the 18-year-old in order for their immunization records to remain in the ImmTrac2 database. If written consent is not submitted, their immunization records will not remain in the database. A representative from the Milam County Health Department meets with 12th graders at school annually about ImmTrac2 and maintaining their records in the database.
