HEALTH AND SAFETY POLICY STATEMENT

Deer Park Archers Limited is strongly committed to encouraging our members to take part, but the health, well-being and safety of everyone is always our paramount concern. We recommend levels of training dependent on age and ability and expect our junior athletes to participate within these boundaries.

HEALTH AND SAFETY POLICY

To support our Health and Safety policy statement, we are committed to the following duties:

- Ensuring that all members are aware of and can access our health and safety policy.
- Undertaking regular, recorded risk assessments of the club premises and all activities undertaken by the club.
- Creating a safe environment by putting health and safety measures in place as identified by the assessments.
- Ensure all members are able to obtain the appropriate level of training and competition by assessing individual ability, age, maturity and development.
- Undertaking regular club equipment checks and routine maintenance.
- Have a competent club member to assist with health and safety responsibilities.
- Inform all our members of our normal operating procedures and our emergency operating procedures in all our shooting ranges.
- Provide access to adequate first aid facilities, telephones and as often as possible have a qualified first aider on site.
- Reporting any injuries or accidents sustained during any club activity or whilst on the club premises.
- Ensuring that the implementation of this policy is reviewed regularly and monitored for effectiveness.

AS A CLUB MEMBER YOU HAVE A DUTY TO:

- Understand and follow the health and safety policy.
- Be aware of the normal operating procedures and the emergency operating procedures in the venue you are shooting in.

- Take reasonable care for your own health and safety and that of others who may be affected by what you do or not do.
- Co-operate with the club on health and safety issues.
- Attend a beginner's course and correctly use equipment provided by the club.
- Not interfere with, or misuse anything provided for your health, safety or welfare.
