Federal Student Aid Update: Widespread Lack of Communication and Platform Errors

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) opened for the 2022-2023 school year on October 1, 2021. However, due to capacity challenges at Federal Student Aid (FSA) at the U.S. Department of Education (ED), the campaign to notify borrowers of their application status has been much less than years prior. While their online communications through social media and their website hold a host of resources and options for support, their individual user reminders and support did not occur as in past years. With the lowest FAFSA completion rates in recent years, it is critical that counselors and advisors ensure students are aware of the status of their 2022-2023 FAFSA form. Along with challenges regarding notifications and communications, there have been numerous technical issues with the FSA platform for students and families.

NCAN recently led a letter to ED cataloging the numerous technical issues that users have reported, urging ED to act quickly to resolve these issues, as students rely on the funding opportunities they receive through the FAFSA.

Students Can Apply Now for the Fall Semester at a California Community College

As the spring semester approaches, there are still eligible students on the fence about enrolling at California community college. Prospective students are encouraged to enroll now in classes and plan ahead for future semesters. The benefits can't be ignored.

Attending a California community college doubles an individual's chance of finding a job compared to those who do not complete high school. In addition, students who obtain a degree or certificate from a California community college nearly double their earnings within three years, which puts them on track to earn a good living wage and be able to provide for themselves and their families.

Prospective students should first visit ICanGoToCollege.com, a website available in English, Spanish, Chinese and Vietnamese, that includes information about enrollment, the variety of available financial aid opportunities, transfer and career training programs offered at community colleges all in one central location. The website also offers a short online Career Opportunities quiz that can help prospective students learn about potential career paths that might interest them.

California community colleges are the largest provider of workforce training in the nation, making them a significant contributor to the state's pipeline of talent for high-demand industries. In fact, there are more than 200 career training opportunities available at the 116 California community colleges statewide. Additionally, students can transfer to a four-year university or college with guaranteed junior status after completing two years at a community college.

Community colleges offer flexible scheduling and access to helpful resources allowing students to remain home or close to home. Support services are also available at community colleges to help with tutoring, counseling, career planning and health and wellness. Additionally, financial aid is available year-round to help cover many of the costs for attending a community college.

UC Application Extensions

Students interested in UC who have not yet applied still have the opportunity to be at UC in fall 2022. Applications are being accepted at UC Merced for both freshman and transfer applicants until January 7. UC Riverside and UC Santa Cruz will accept only transfer applications until January 7.

The UC website has resources on admission requirements, and information on Financial Aid including the new Tuition Stability Plan, the Blue and Gold Opportunity program and the Middle Class Scholarship program.

Founded in 1965, Volunteers in Service to America (VISTA) is a federal anti-poverty national service program designed to provide resources to nonprofit organizations and public agencies to address poverty and poverty-related problems in the United States. VISTA is now incorporated into the AmeriCorps network of national service programs, housed at the federal agency AmeriCorps, formerly known as the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS). VISTA projects place year-long volunteers at organizations to help build capacity and fight poverty in their communities. VISTA Projects must be developed in accordance with four core principles: an anti-poverty focus; community empowerment; sustainable solutions; and
