You are a First Class scout and in good standing.

Training

A Historian must attend troop-level Historian Training.

Troop Journal

A Historian should maintain the Troop Journal to record troop meetings, activities and events. Use photos and interviews. Record participation.

Purpose

Your record will be used for future Courts of Honor, Cub Scout recruiting and PLC planning meetings. Future troops will appreciate your record.

Participation

You should attend as many troop events as you can. If you can't attend, your should make sure that you interview participants and obtain information and photos for the journal. A Historian should track troop awards and recognitions to ensure they are recorded and preserved.

Communication

Good communication is critical to your success as Historian. You should talk with the SPL, ASPL and Patrol leaders to ensure history is recorded.. Remember who, what, when, where, why and how.
