Also a nice thing about Umbraco is because it is so flexible and pluggable it allows for Passion First. So if you have been following the discussion around is Code First good or not... I think we have to stop thinking in terms of charts and hours, what is more productive ...but more on what do I love to do during my job. It's ok not to care about the latest tech features and jump on the bandwagon just because it's the new hot stuff...you aren't a bad developer because you aren't using the latest stuff. Just find something you love and that makes you happy to go to your job and you'll build awesome stuff!

Same with the xslt/razor discussion, it's not because you still use xslt that you are an bad Umbraco dev.. respect that...

Another example, code conventions, are you a bad dev by not using them? If you can deliver awesome stuff and don't care about them...

But of course we still have to move Umbraco forward and we'll always try to add new stuff if that makes it easier to get started with Umbraco,... (getting rid of frustrations)

Become an Umbraco dev and be happy?

So are you saying that all Umbraco devs are happy and you'll be too if you join the community? No.. just try to listen to your feelings and find what makes you happy
