Culinary track (Oceano Community Center, Mon-Wed, 2:30-4:30 PM)

Students help prepare meals for our shelter residents. They learn food prep, portioning and labeling, safe handling, cleanup, and teamwork — all under staff guidance. A consistent schedule is best so they can build skills over time.

Office internship (Grover Beach, min. 1 hr/week, long-term commitment)

Students start with filing, scanning, data entry, and basic spreadsheets, then can grow into scheduling support, event logistics, inventory tracking, and communications. We ask for at least one hour per week, with a preference for a longer-term commitment since training takes staff time. Our last intern, Gaby, had a wonderful experience and

came away with stronger professional communication, spreadsheet skills, event support knowledge, and habits around confidentiality and follow-through.

One-time office projects

For students with limited time, we can host them for simpler tasks such as filing, data entry, or assembly. These short visits help us gauge engagement before inviting students into more complex projects.

Art option – Bowl Painting (through Oct 9)

For students in art programs, we have our Empty Bowls fundraiser coming up on October 9. Volunteer groups can take a kit with unpainted bisque bowls and paint supplies, paint the bowls, and return them for firing. These bowls are then featured at the event and selected by participants in exchange for donations.

(Link) > Community Farm in SLO has volunteer Saturdays

Volunteers 18 and under must be accompanied by an adult. All volunteers must sign a release of liability waiver and adhere to the policies in our volunteer handbook (waiver must be signed by a legal guardian for those under 18).

Saturday volunteer days take place on the second and fourth Saturday of each month from 9 AM - 12 PM. Typical volunteer day activities include planting, weeding, harvesting, compost management, and animal management. No experience is required.

Harvest volunteer shifts take place every Tuesday and Thursday from 9 AM - 12 PM. Harvest Team Volunteers must commit to at least 2 days/month, as harvest techniques are specialized and require initial training. New harvest volunteers must attend a training shift before attending a harvest shift. Training shifts are scheduled as needed. Must be 18 or older.
