The North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services has received approval to implement the first phase of the Disaster Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (D-SNAP) in 25 western NC counties and for members of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians who live in zip code 28719. They estimate more than 150,000 people in Western NC will apply for up to a combined \$120 million in benefits, but the window to apply is short, and they need your help making sure people who may be eligible know about D-SNAP and apply.

Phase one of D-SNAP begins on Friday, October 18, and the application period closes on Thursday, October 24.

Eligible households will receive a one-time benefit on a debit-like card (called an Electronic Benefits Transfer, or EBT card) to help buy food. The exact amount will depend on household size, income and estimated losses. The benefits are good for up to nine months. The impacted counties are: Alexander, Alleghany, Ashe, Avery, Buncombe, Burke, Caldwell, Catawba, Clay, Cleveland, Gaston, Haywood, Henderson, Jackson, Lincoln, Macon, Madison, McDowell, Mitchell, Polk, Rutherford, Transylvania, Watauga, Wilkes, and Yancey Counties. People are encouraged to apply by phone at the D-SNAP Virtual Call Center at 1-844-453-1117 or complete a pre-registration online using the <u>ePASS Pre-Registration Tool.</u> which will open on Oct. 15 for pre-registration and close on Oct. 22. Applicants will then receive a call to complete the registration with an interview over the phone. People can also apply at a <u>D-SNAP location</u> in their county. For a full list of places

to apply and for more details, visit <u>ncdhhs.gov/dsnap</u>. Residents will be notified if they have been approved within three days of their application and will be able to pick up their EBT card in person at their county's D-SNAP site or have their card mailed to them overnight at the address they list in the application. Residents are encouraged to apply for D-SNAP by phone on their assigned day by last name.

Small Business Disaster Recovery Steps in North Carolina

- 1. **Assess and Document Damage**: After a disaster, the first step is to assess the extent of the damage to your property, equipment, inventory, and other business assets. Document everything thoroughly with photos, videos, and detailed notes to have a clear record. This is crucial for reporting the incident to insurance providers and other agencies, ensuring you capture the full scope of the loss.
- 2. **Contact Insurance Carrier:** Once the damage is documented, notify your insurance provider immediately to begin the claims process. Provide them with the documentation of the damage and work closely to understand the timeline and requirements for receiving compensation. Be proactive in following up and ensuring all paperwork is correctly filed to expedite the claim.
- 3. **Contact FEMA:** If the disaster qualifies for federal assistance, contact the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). FEMA offers resources, grants, and low-interest loans to help businesses recover from federally declared disasters. - 4. Contact SBA: The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) provides disaster recovery loans to businesses affected by disasters. These loans can help cover the costs of repairs, rebuilding, and operational recovery. Reach out to the SBA for guidance on the loan application process and gather the necessary documentation to apply for financial assistance. - 6. **Contact Suppliers**: Notify your suppliers about the disaster and discuss how it might affect your orders, deliveries, and supply chain. Collaborating with suppliers early helps minimize disruptions and may offer temporary adjustments to payment terms or delivery schedules, allowing your business to get back on track faster.
- 7. **Contact Creditors**: If your business has existing loans or financial obligations, inform your lenders about the disaster. Many financial institutions offer disaster relief options, such as loan deferments, payment restructuring, or temporary interest rate reductions, to help ease financial strain during recovery.
- 8. Get Help from the SBCN (Small Business Center Network): The Small Business Center Network (SBCN) in North Carolina provides free counseling, resources, and support to small businesses recovering from disasters. Reach out for guidance on navigating recovery, accessing grants or loans and assistance with applications, and obtaining referrals to other necessary resources.
