These are 4 amazing options and each have their own benefits/features.

Option 1 - Use Google Slides and adjust your page size to be portrait and 8.5x11 inches. You can place anything anywhere on the sheet!

- Open a document/slide in Google Drive.
- In the toolbar, click File Page setup.
- Go to the setting you want to change: Orientation. Paper size. Page color. Margins.
- Make your changes.
- Click OK.

Optional: To make new documents open with the settings you chose, click Set as default OK.
