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**EXTENDED ABSTRACT GUIDELINES**

Extended abstracts should be written according to the structure below:

- 1. Abstract** (objective, method, findings, future recommendation) **and 5 Keywords** (Times New Roman, 10 font size, justified, single spacing)
- 2. Introduction**
- 3. Methods**
- 4. Results and Discussions**
- 5. Conclusion and Recommendations**
- 6. Acknowledgement** (research grant, organization and/or scholarship where relevant)
- 7. Suggested SDG**
- 8. References** (APA Style 7th Edition)
- 9. Note:**
  - Times New Roman, 1.5 line spacing and 11 font size.
  - Extended abstracts should **NOT EXCEED 5 PAGES** including the references
  - Pages should not be numbered.

## Example for extended abstracts:

### TITLE

(TIMES NEW ROMAN, 14 FONT SIZE, BOLD, ALL CAPS, CENTERED)

**Abstract:** Abstract should be written with 10 font size, Times New Roman, justified, single line spacing. **Objective, method, findings, future recommendation** are summarized in this section.

**Keywords:** This section should contain maximum 5 words that are written in 10 font size and separated with commas.

### GENERAL GUIDELINES

Extended abstracts should be written according to the below structure including the following headings: **abstract and keywords, introduction, methods, findings and argument, conclusion and recommendations.** There is flexibility as to the naming of the sections. Sub-headings can be used when necessary.

Extended abstract shall be written in font Times New Roman, 1.5 line spacing and 11 font size. Extended abstracts can contain figures, tables and/or images. Page format should be A4 page size. **Extended abstracts should not exceed 5 pages including the references** and pages should not be numbered.

### INTRODUCTION (Heading Times New Roman, 11 font size, bold)

The introduction section should (1) present the scope and objective of the paper and state the problem, (2) briefly review the pertinent literature, (3) describe the methods, and (4) provide an overview of the main results of the work.

### METHODS

The methodology must be clearly stated and described in sufficient detail or with sufficient references.

### RESULTS AND DISCUSSIONS

The results and discussions of the work should be explicitly described and illustrated. Supporting figures, tables and images of the results (no more than two figures and two tables) may be included in the extended abstract.

All the tables, images and figures should be centered. Figures and images should be numbered and figure headers should be placed under the figure or image; as for the tables, they should also

be numbered and the table header should be placed at the top. References (if any) of the tables, figures and images should be presented right under the tables, figures and images in the form of author surname and publication date.

**For the extended abstract discussing a concept paper:** The Results and Discussions section must explicitly describe and illustrate the work's findings. Since the work utilizes secondary data, these results are to be presented as the findings obtained from library or desktop research. Analysis from the pertinent literature must then be integrated to thoroughly discuss, interpret, and contextualize these findings.

## **CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS**

Conclusions should include (1) the principles and generalizations inferred from the results, (2) any exceptions to, or problems with these principles and generalizations, (3) theoretical and/or practical implications of the work, and (5) conclusions drawn and recommendations.
