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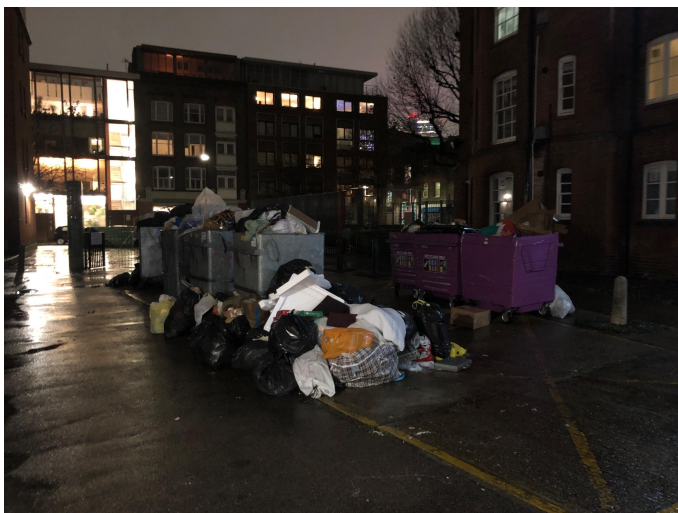

There used to be a small street bin on Hocker St / Virginia Rd junction which attracted a similar mess and we had it moved, which largely cured the problem.

Now these larger bins are left in the street and it amplifies the problem. Compounded by the fact that there were a number of missed collections (and no collection at all for the general waste) this week.

A large part of the demand for these bins is coming from the residents of Godfrey Place who find them more convenient than their own basement facility. Part of the solution is to have no bins located on the street at this location. For the residents of Datchet house there is a general waste bin that should be behind a locked door.

For the fly tipping, I have no idea if the council is actively using fines as a deterrent. Much of this waste will have an identifiable address.

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This is the state of the courtyard after a bin collection. A mix of commercial and domestic waste, evidence that they don't collect any overspill . So the moment the bin is emptied there is already so much overspill that when correctly put in the bin by residents after collection and it's already full the same day - so the cycle continues.
