What is it and why does it matter?

Llamazing Alpaca Explorers is a series of independent learning guides for youth in grades 3 and up to get to know llamas and alpacas. [Part 1: Llama-Alpaca Body Bonanza](#), includes 7 activity guides focused on llama-alpaca history and anatomy. THIS set, *Part 2: Llama-Alpaca Herds and Handling*, includes 4 activity guides that teach you how to handle your llama-alpaca safely. Each guide teaches you about llamas-alpacas through pictures, videos, and hands-on activities. Understanding the behavior of these amazing creatures, you can corral them and enjoy their company in a way that keeps both you and them safe and happy. Stay tuned for Part 3, which will teach you about llama-alpaca housing and care!



What are the guides?

1. [Meeting Your Camelid](#) - Learn the difference between a llama and an alpaca and how to be safe around, approach, and lead a llama or alpaca for the first time.
2. [Llama-Alpaca Bubble](#) - Learn how to navigate a llama-alpaca's personal space, or personal bubble, so you can approach it safely in any situation, whether it's loose in a pen or with its herd in the pasture.
3. [Camelid Headgear](#) - Learn the parts of a halter, how to know a halter fits properly, and how to put the halter on the llama or alpaca.
4. [Llama-Alpaca Herding: Easier Than Cats!](#) - Use what you know about llama-alpaca behavior to learn how to gather llamas-alpacas from the pasture into an enclosed space.

We want everyone to learn to love and appreciate these cool camelids! Though you can use these guides without a live llama or alpaca, it's very helpful to have access to one.
