Приложение 3. Explain why.

1. It happened 3 thousand years ago. Two Viking chieftains went with their men in two big boats to Ireland. The first chieftain's name was Heremon O'Neill, the name of the other we don't know. "The first of us who will touch the Irish land will be the king of it". What did Heremon O'Neill do to win the competition? How is this story connected with the national flag of Ireland?
 - When the boats were near the Irish coast, O'Neill quickly cut off his right hand and threw it over to the land, his hand touched the land first and he became the king of Ireland, that's why there is a picture of a hand on the flag of Ireland..

2. The thistle has nothing pleasant in it, especially if you carelessly touch its thorns. But it has an important meaning for the people of Scotland. Why did the Scottish people choose this thorny plant as the national emblem of their country?

- There are many stories and theories about how this happened, but the most popular is this: According to legend, an invading Norse army was attempting to sneak up at night upon a Scottish army's encampment. During this operation one barefoot Norseman had the misfortune to step on a thistle, causing him to cry out in pain, thus alerting Scots to the presence of the Norse invaders. Some sources suggest the specific occasion was the Battle of Largs, but it is not certain.

3. In Scotland the people have many different traditions and ceremonies connected with the New Year. How do they predict their future with the help of an ivy leaf ?

- Centuries ago it was the custom to put an ivy leaf in water on New Year's Eve and leave it there until Twelfth Night. If the leaf remained fresh and green, it foretold a good healthy year; if not – this meant illness in the family.

4. There is a place connected with Scotland almost in the centre of London. What is the name of this place? What is it there now? And what was it there in the 14th century?

- Scotland Yard is the headquarters of the Metropolitan Police in London. That was the place where in about the 14th century, the royalty and nobility of Scotland stayed when visiting the English Court.

5. Why do the British wear the poppies on their clothes on the 11th of November? What does the Queen do in the middle of Whitehall on this day?

- To remember the dead from the two world wars, The Queen lays the first wreath of poppies.

6. Sometimes during the day you can see the flag flies on top of Victoria Tower and a light burns above Big Ben in the clock tower. What does it mean? What do the people of London think at that time?

- It means that the Parliament has the debates on highly important matters.

7. There is Fleet Street in London but it has nothing in common with ships and army of the country. Who met in the coffee-houses of this street in the 18th century? What is the street the center of?

- Writers met to talk in the coffee-houses in Fleet Street in the 18th century. Now it's the center of Britain's national newspapers, which have their offices there or nearby.

8. A lot of legends in Wales are connected with the name of St.David. One of them is about wearing a leek. Who did he ask to wear a leek and when? What is the present tradition connected with the Royal Family?

- A legend tells how David suggested that his people should wear a leek in their bonnets during the battle so that they could be easily recognized. It is a tradition now that every member of the Brigade of the Welsh Guards is given a leek by a member of the Royal Family.

9. When we say Wales we mean different things. For example, a great number of wells. Why do people throw money into the wells?

- Some wishing wells are said to help love affairs, others can heal the sick.

10. Iron is always believed to be lucky by the Irish. What legend is connected with this believe?

- The legend tells that once the island was hidden under the water, after 7 years the island appeared out of the water. It looked so beautiful that brave people tried to build new houses and remain on it. But after 7 years it was swallowed by the sea. It was known that the island could be saved from the sea only by burying a piece of iron in its heart. When another 7 years passed a brave man came and buried his sword in its heart. After that the island was not swallowed up by the waves again.
