## <u>Educational Equity – School and Community Resources for Neurodivergent Students</u>

Senate Bill 939 (Chapter 907, Statutes of 2024) amended Education Code sections 234.5, 234.6, and 32283.5, which will take effect January 1, 2025. Starting with the 2025-26 school year, each local educational agency, including charter schools, will be required to ensure that resources related to neurodiversity developed by the UC/CSU Collaborative for Neurodiversity and Learning are readily accessible in a prominent location on each local educational agency's website that is easily accessible to parents/guardians and students. The goal of the UC/CSU Collaborative for Neurodiversity and Learning is to dramatically improve literacy for all children, particularly those with reading challenges such as dyslexia. Their website provides a collection of resources related to literacy (e.g., podcasts, magazine articles, and training modules.) The rationale for this bill was that it will help and acknowledge students with neurodivergence, which is a spectrum of differences in brain function and behavioral traits encompassing conditions such as autism spectrum disorder, ADHD, dyslexia, and more.
