Pop Culture ~ Class Breakdown

The full title of the course is "20th Century American Pop Culture: A Social History of the United States." This semester course is a social study of the United States that will provide you with an understanding of major trends in art, literature, movies, music, television, radio, fashion, and fads during the last 100+ years. You will gain an understanding of these cultural trends from a decade-by-decade approach. The best way to gain this understanding is to be immersed in it. As a result, you will be listening to music, watching movies and TV, and dancing popular dances from the decades we cover. You will have the opportunity to experience what was "rad," "groovy," and "bananas" during each of the eras we cover.

Be Prepared - Every day, you will need:

- * Your Notebook : (a place for handouts like a folder or section of a 3-ring binder) * Pen * Agenda Planner
- Come prepared you will not be permitted to go to your locker / previous class if you forgot something.

Classwork - Class will begin at the posted time. I expect that you will be ready go at that time. Classwork not completed in class because you were working on material for another class will not be accepted late. As per school policy, any classwork (including tests) missed because of a cut will be a grade of zero.

Absenteeism – All students are expected to make up tests and quizzes within two days after a one-day absence. If you can not stay after, expect to make up the quiz or test during lunch or a free period. It is your responsibility to see me about a makeup time, and if the assessment is not made up promptly, you will receive a grade of "zero." If you schedule a make-up time for a test/quiz but do not show, your grade for the test/quiz will be a zero. It is also expected that you come prepared with all homework assignments after an absence, if you were in school when it was assigned. Keep track of your absences. More than 7 unexcused absences may result in loss of course credit.

If I were a teenager... reflections

You will have the opportunity to consider your own opinions about the pop culture of the 20th century by writing 4 reflections throughout the semester. Each reflection will focus on a specific time period and will include your own thoughts about the pop culture of that time and what you would have been interested in had you been alive then.

Quizzes

At the end of each unit, you will have a quiz about the pop culture of that decade. You will need to know both the pop culture and the history that influenced the pop culture for that decade. As we progress throughout the semester, you will also need to make connections between the pop culture of the different decades. *Any cell phone use during a testing period will result in an automatic detention AND grade of zero on the exam.*

Projects

You will have several projects throughout the semester that you will need to complete.

Daily participation and in-class attitude

All students will contribute to the class daily. You will be expected to participate in all class activities. This includes everything from our hula hoop contest to creating a story using slang words of the current decade of study. If you cause a disturbance to me or the class through constant talking to your neighbor, or if you are regularly on your phone, or if you leave your earbuds in during class, this portion of your grade will be impacted.

Homework/Other

You will not have much homework, so it is important you do the work assigned, or your grade will suffer. (If you are absent, it is your responsibility to check Google Classroom.)

You will be expected to complete a project at the end of the semester that will count towards your 4th marking period grade
